Begin With a Prayer of Gratitude


Consider current realities of our country -- for what and for whom are you most grateful?

Ask for God's Guidance

Invite the Spirit of God to illuminate your reflections.

Enlightened by the Spirit, Prayerfully Review Our Nation at this Point in History; Pay Attention to Your Emotions and Reactions

- *What energizes you or brings you closer to God as you reflect on our country?*
 - *What distracts you or makes you feel farther from God as you reflect on our country?*
 - *What is the current situation of your brothers and sisters, particularly those who are most vulnerable and often marginalized by poverty and injustice?*
 - *What are the ways that your identity and privileges shape your perspective and vision for our country?*
- Allow your honest reactions, emotions, and desires to surface.*



Conversation with God

- *Consider perhaps one or two of the strongest desires or feelings evoked by your prayer about our country and bring this to God.*
- *Engage God in conversation over these desires or feelings, speaking simply, clearly, directly, and honestly, as one friend speaks to another.*
- *What areas of your life as a faithful citizen do you lament?*
- *What communities, groups, or aspects of creation in our nation need healing and reconciliation?*
- *What is God's desire for people who are marginalized by poverty and injustice?*
- *What areas of your life/our nation's life do you rejoice in and celebrate fidelity to Gospel values?*
- *Listen with your heart -- how is God present to you through your reactions and desires?*

Prayer of Renewal and Resolution

As we prepare to elect new leaders, how will you promote the common good? Ask God for the assistance you need to enact the greater, more lasting good for all God's people. Is there a specific attitude you want to cultivate or an action you want to take? Entrust your desires and intentions to God's grace.



From the Pastor's Desk

There is something about the month of October that invites one to recall memories with meaning. Perhaps the remembering mind may be sparked by the true blue hue of an October sky or inspired by the sounds of leaves being whipped up by fall winds or recalled in the first bite of an autumnal apple or warmly invoked by the aroma of an oven baking pumpkin pie. Yes, October through its sights sounds scents and tastes offers opportunities to remember.



And so how appropriate it was that on the first day of October, more than 200 present and past parishioners gathered to remember the life, laughter and love of Fr. Jim English at a Memorial Mass in his honor. Fr. Jim, who served Holy Trinity as parochial vicar in the early 1970s and then as pastor from 1975 until 1981, passed away this past July. Coincidentally, Fr. Jim's death occurred one day before Fr. Leo Murray passed away on the same floor at Manresa Hall, the Jesuit infirmary at Saint Joseph's University.

The Mass was followed by a reception at Trinity Hall wherein parishioners who knew and loved Fr. Jim back in the 70s shared stories of his charisma and his amazing abilities to shepherd parishioners of all ages through inspired preaching and creative liturgical practices.

At the gathering, I announced the creation of a Father English-Father Murray Memorial Fund. Monies from this eventually-endowed fund will be used for two purposes. As a way of providing a lasting legacy of Fr. Jim, funds will be used to replace or to refurbish liturgical items as well as to provide scholarships for staff or parishioners who seek ongoing liturgical/musical formation. Similarly, given Father Leo's 12 years of providing spiritual direction for parishioners and for training many in Ignatian Spirituality, monies from the Fund will be allotted to provide scholarships for retreats or Ignatian training programs.

United in life as members of the Society of Jesus and in their having each served Holy Trinity Parish, the memorial fund in their name will preserve their presence for past, present and future parishioners of this great parish. May they rest in peace.

Now They're Cooking!



Holy Trinity recently provided funds for Loyola High School in Rerua, India to purchase rice steamers. The Jesuit High School run by Fr. Walter Kongari, S.J. serves 564 students, most of whom reside at the school since they live too far away to commute daily. Previously the school had been cooking with firewood, draining their budget and eradicating local trees. The new rice cooking system allows the school to use one-third the firewood and put the fuel savings and staff time and energy back into the school.

Holy Trinity Will Help Support a Refugee

Family Holy Trinity is partnering with Lutheran Social Services (LSS) – one of the nine voluntary resettlement agencies operating in the U.S. – to co-sponsor a refugee family arriving from the Middle East. As co-sponsors, Holy Trinity parishioners will work closely together to help a newly-arrived refugee family rebuild their lives in America. Parishioners will serve as personal guides through a culture and community that is new and often strange to our refugee neighbors. We will help them reestablish their lives financially, but will also accompany them through this incredibly uncertain and scary time.
