## Update on St. Jean Baptiste

Our sister parish in Haiti, St. Jean Baptiste, lay in the path taken by Hurricane Matthew earlier this month. All communications to the department, Grand'Anse, have been knocked out. We expect communications to be back in the next few days and should be able to contact Pere Medard and others in the community soon.

Hurricane Matthew killed more than 900 people and left thousands of families with nowhere to live. It destroyed crops and decimated livestock, all of which will deprive people of their livelihood. In Grand'Anse, most homes were significantly damaged and major bridges were washed away, cutting the department off from the rest of the country. Potable water is very limited.

Catholic Relief Services is on the ground assessing damage and planning for clean-up. Holy Trinity has donated \$5,000 from Parish Pledge funds to assist CRS's efforts, and **we invite you to consider donating as well at [www.crs.org](http://www.crs.org)**.





## From the Pastor's Desk: About Fr. Kelley

*This weekend's column is written by Fr. Bill Kelley, S.J.*

I hail from Bensalem, a Philadelphia suburb, where I grew up as the second oldest of twelve children. Most of my siblings still live in the Philadelphia area. My first encounter with the Jesuits was as an undergraduate at the University of Scranton.

Upon graduation in 1973, I entered the Society at Wernersville. My first assignment, after novitiate, was to the south of Chile where I taught in a Jesuit high school for three years. Several years of graduate studies followed at Georgetown (Latin American Studies) and Stanford (Political Science).

At one time, I had my sights set on teaching at a Jesuit university in Latin America. During graduate studies, however, my heart increasingly veered toward pastoral work. I did return to Chile, but as a parish priest, not as a university professor. That first experience of parish work had me hooked!

When I returned to the United States three years later, I continued in parish work – much of it in Latino communities in California, North Carolina and New Jersey. My last parish assignment prior to returning to Holy Trinity was at Holy Name Parish in Camden, NJ where I served as pastor between 2003-2009.

In 2009 I was “loaned” to the California province to serve as provincial assistant for pastoral ministries, coordinating the works of our 14 parishes and two Ignatian Spirituality centers. In that position, I particularly enjoyed working with some of our more under-resourced parishes, especially helping to strengthen their pastoral and finance councils.

One of the more difficult duties that fell to me, however, was overseeing the withdrawal of the Jesuits from six of our 14 parishes due to the declining number of Jesuits. Although, none of the six parishes was closed, it was heartbreaking to return these parishes to the diocese after many years of Jesuits ministry –in one case, more than 100 years.

I spent the 18 months immediately prior to coming to Holy Trinity as the Director of Social and International Ministries at the Jesuit Conference located here in Washington DC, coordinating the Jesuits' advocacy efforts regarding migration, domestic poverty, criminal justice reform, and environmental justice. After seven years in administration, I felt a hunger to return to work that was more directly pastoral.

When Holy Trinity was mentioned as a possible venue, I was delighted. I was already well-acquainted with the parish's many activities, especially in the areas of the social justice and Ignatian spirituality. I look forward to many years of ministry here!

## Daily Mass Intentions

Advent begins on November 27, and the following Sunday, December 4, our Associate Pastor Fr. William Ryan, S.J., will offer insights into our **Liturgical year calendar**. On December 18, Professor Alan Mitchel will offer an overview of the **Gospel of Matthew**, the gospel for the new liturgical year.

During the second week of Advent, Fr. Peter Gyves, S.J., will lead a mission with a focus on “**A Faith that Does Justice.**” Over four evenings, he will offer reflections on how we might become more aware of God’s presence in our lives as seen through the lens of Ignatian spirituality. Using Ignatius of Loyola’s conversion and the spiritual exercises, Fr. Gyves will emphasize taking seriously Jesus of the gospel stories and a faith-based rationale for a commitment to social justice by incarnating the values of love, compassion and justice in our world. Fr. Gyves’ presentation begins December 11. Details and dates/times on the website.

Additionally there are several stand alone presentations that offer a variety of topics: October 30, 10:10 am, **500 years of Reformation** presented by John Borelli and November 6<sup>th</sup>, 10:10am, Reflections: **A Week Serving in a Syrian Refugee Camp**, presented by Linda Arnold. November 13 and 20 will feature a two-part “**Raising Faith filled Kids,**” exploring the how we keep our children safe – web safe, in school, as mandated by the Archdiocese of Washington, challenges in our society and then sharing how parents meet the challenges in their homes and practices that work for their families. This will be offered at 10:10am.
