Holy Trinity's Faith Formation Ministry

"Evangelizing is the Church's mission. It is not the mission of only a few, but it is mine, yours and ours... We must all be evangelizers, especially with our life!"
- Pope Francis, May 2013

As Catholic Christians, we are called to live our faith fully, and that requires lifelong learning. We must renew and deepen our understanding of our faith - ongoing faith formation makes this possible. Holy Trinity's Faith Formation Ministry invites all parishioners into this intentional process so that we may be transformed and fulfill our Baptismal call to live as Jesus' disciples on earth.

On September 11, our Sunday-morning religious education classes begin. More than 800 students are expected - we'll highlight this vibrant program in a future bulletin article. We know, however, it isn't just our young parishioners who our Faith Formation Program seeks to educate.

As adult Catholics, we are confronted every day with tough questions that need to be addressed from many perspectives, including a spiritual one. How we think about and respond to these issues is important, especially if we are to be "men and women for others," as St. Ignatius Loyola challenges us to be. In collaboration with the parish's Social Justice, Ignatian Spirituality and Worship ministries, our adult formation program will introduce a number of educational opportunities to help us with the challenges of our world today.

Beginning November 5th, we'll kick off a multi-week program to deepen our understanding of Islam from the perspective of our Muslim brothers and sisters. Imam Yahya Hendi, the Muslim chaplain at Georgetown University, will present "Perspectives on Faith, Creed and Sharia, The Quran and Muhammed, A History from Mecca to America." Imam Hendi is well known for his work to foster peaceful relationships among people and to engage others in constructive interfaith dialogue. The series will run through early December, culminating in a presentation and interactive session with Imam Hendi and our pastor, Fr. Kevin Gillespie, entitled, "Mary: The Embodiment of Mercy and Compassion."

To begin the season of Advent, Fr. William Ryan, SJ, our associate pastor, will offer insights for the new liturgical year by presenting an overview of the gospel of Matthew. Ground your understanding of the gospel that we will begin using on the first Sunday of Advent.

During the second week of Advent, Fr. Peter Gyves, SJ, will lead a mission with a focus on "A Faith that Does Justice." Over four sessions, he will offer reflections on how we might become more aware of God's presence in our lives as seen through the lens of Ignatian spirituality. Using Ignatius of Loyola's conversion and the Spiritual Exercises, Fr. Gyves will emphasize taking seriously, the Jesus of the gospel stories and a faith-based rationale for a commitment to social justice by incarnating the values of love, compassion and justice in our world.

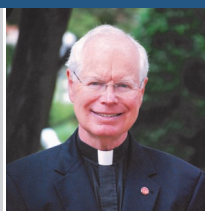

From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend's column is written by Fr. Paul Campbell, SJ, Associate Pastor

This is not the Pastor! I'm Paul Campbell, the newly-arrived Parochial Vicar, and Kevin Gillespie has asked me to introduce myself to you.

I grew up amid "The Troubles" in Belfast, N. Ireland and learned early on that the beauty and majesty of this world could be marred by hatred and violence. In 1974, I joined the Jesuits in Dublin and after 5 years moved to Paris to study Philosophy. A few years later, I went to Japan where I spent nearly a decade learning the language, teaching in a Jesuit high school and studying Theology.

After ordination to the priesthood in 1988, I studied Communications at Syracuse University and then taught at Le Moyne College for several years. A mid-life career change took brought me to Hollywood (well, Culver City to be exact!) for a brief but exciting stint as a video producer before a ten-year posting at Loyola Press in Chicago where, most recently, I served as publisher.

Last year, my Provincial Superior suggested it was time for a change. He proposed three distinct possibilities: 1. A return to academic work, 2. Become the Principal of a new high school on a tiny Pacific island (I kid you not!) or 3. Move to Holy Trinity Parish to do pastoral work.

After prayer and consideration, I asked him to mission me to Holy Trinity. I have only been here for a couple of weeks, but I am confident that we made a good decision. Apart from the horrid humidity, I have enjoyed being here and everyone I've met so far has been very welcoming and encouraging. In the weeks and months ahead, I hope to get to know you all.

In advance, I ask forgiveness if I forget your name or, worse still, call you the wrong name. I will do my best, but my aging brain increasingly refuses to cooperate with me!
