Bread for the World

The Bible is full of lessons about the need to nourish ourselves, both spiritually and physically. The Apostle Paul, for example, reminds us that because of Christ’s death and resurrection, we are “a new creation” (2 Corinthians 5:17). Then there are the stories of Joseph in Egypt trying to avoid famine, Jesus feeding the thousands and people from many nations gathering to receive the Holy Spirit in Acts. Reflecting on these readings, might we be moved to do our part to end hunger?

On **May 20-21**, we will have an opportunity to act on this invitation when Holy Trinity conducts its annual offering of letters to Congress called Bread for the World. We will ask Congress to consider funding decisions that put us on track to end hunger by 2030 and to invest in programs that help feed low-income families like the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP/food stamps) and tax credits.

Look for the table in front of church after mass. And, should you feel the call, raise your voice to help end hunger.

Living Our Mission

“Mothers and their children are in a category all their own. There's no bond so strong in the entire world. No love so instantaneous and forgiving.”

It is often said that the closest love to God's love is a mother's love for her child. “As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; and you will be comforted over Jerusalem” (Isaiah 66:13).

We asked Holy Trinity staff to reflect on their favorite memory of their mother to celebrate today both Mother's Day and God's love.

Father Gillespie: “One of my favorite memories of my mother is celebrating her birthday the same weekend as Mother's Day. It was a great weekend for our family. On her 80th birthday, we gave my mother a statue of St. Francis to remind her of her love for flowers and nature.

“She was delighted in sharing her love of gardening and bringing beauty into the world with us. Today, every time I see a statue of St. Francis or see a flower I think of Mom and her love for me, my family and all of those whom her life had touched.”

Beth Hoffmann: “My mom was never a woman of many words. She's not the big talker in the room, so the kind of advice that my mom gave that was the best was usually by example. She was always the first one up in the morning. I grew up in the Midwest, so she'd be out in the barn taking care of the animals before we were awake. She would work late at night—she was a teacher, so she'd cook us a meal and then sit for hours prepping and grading her student's work.

“She generally put everyone else as her concern; she showed such devotion to doing good work, and doing good work for other people. I still feel as though I can never live up to the example that she set for me, but it's an inspiration and I turn back to it all the time.”

Tass McCarthy: “To be kind is by far the biggest lesson my mother taught me. She always said “kindness births kindness” in Greek. We grew up all brothers and my dad has a construction company, so it was manly-man all the time. My mom brought us back down and told us it didn't matter who you are or what you're about, you always need to be kind and show people love, and it will be reciprocated.”

And a final pearl of motherly wisdom from soon-to-be mom **Sara Seligmann**, who recalls the advice *her* mother gave the most (usually in sung form!): “Always listen to your mother, she's always right.”

St. Jean Baptiste Scholarships

Holy Trinity collaborates with our sister parish in Haiti, St. Jean Baptiste, to offer scholarships for students from the parish's secondary school, The College of St. Raymond. Following the success of our three awardees from the Class of 2016, Holy Trinity, supported through a grant from our tithe program, will continue to make post-secondary study a viable option for future graduates. Twenty-five of the 35 graduates from this year's class have applied for one of our SJB scholarships.

Given satisfactory academic progress as full time students, the scholarships are renewed each year for a maximum of four years. The scholarships are for tuition and fees only and will be sent directly to the university. The students are responsible for all other expenses, including room, board and books.
