This year, Ash Wednesday falls on **March 1**. While Lent can be a time for spiritual renewal, it is also a time to encounter Christ in many areas of our lives. Most of us engage individually in the traditional practices of Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We invite you to enrich your journey to Easter by joining with your fellow parishioners in additional activities hosted by the parish. The Faith Formation team, in partnership with the Social Justice and Ignatian Spirituality teams, has created several opportunities for you to do this during Lent.

The children of the parish will be invited to participate in the **Rice Bowl** project through Catholic Relief Services. The donations to the Rice Bowls enable CRS to continue their work around the world. The CRS web site offers daily reflections at *www.crsricebowl.org*.

On Friday evenings during Lent, we will host a **Simple Supper**. Join with other parishioners for a Lenten reflection followed by a simple soup dinner and fellowship. Parish ministries will offer a time for prayer, discussion or a movie along with the supper.

You will find complimentary copies of the booklet, *Sacred Space for Lent*, in the back of the church beginning on Ash Wednesday. Throughout the Lenten season, each day includes a Scripture reading and points of reflection, as well as a weekly topic enhanced by six steps of prayer and meditation.

From the Pastor's Desk

For more than 12 years, I served as a professor and a clinical supervisor in the Pastoral Counseling Department of Loyola University Maryland. During my tenure, I taught as well as learned both the art and science of pastoral caregiving. One can describe the process as if it were a river that flows from God's creative love into our consciences, outward through movements of compassion and guided by competence which broaden and deepen the waters of our Christian community.

I was reminded of this image when I read about the many Archdiocese of Washington programs listed under the Cardinal's Appeal. Three categories of programmatic care are listed with each category having three programs. They are the following:

Caring for All: *Respecting Life*, such as programs supporting unborn children and their mothers; *Homeless Outreach*, such as programs at St. Maria's Meals; and *Whole-Person Care*, such as the services offered by Spanish Catholic Center, which include medical and dental clinics, job training programs, English classes, a food pantry, etc.

Sharing our Faith: *Campus Ministry*, providing worship services, retreats and other programs; *Catechesis*, providing effective ways of forming Christian disciples; and *Communications*, sharing the Gospel message using traditional and new media.

Preparing to Lead: *Vocations*, promoting priestly vocations; *Catholic Education,* fostering a strong educational foundation and rigorous academic programs; and *Diversity and Outreach,* supporting the unique spiritual needs of those belonging to different ethnic and cultural backgrounds.

Certainly these plethora of pastoral programs suggest the broad and deep river of the Christian community that the Cardinal's Appeal fosters. The Appeal program, however, cannot flow without the generous donations from diocesan parishioners such as yourselves. Allow me to give you a brief overview of last year's giving.

In 2016, Holy Trinity parishioners pledged over \$306,000 toward a goal of nearly \$301,000, which amounted to 102% of the goal. However, only around \$296,000 was actually paid, about 98% of the pledge. Our average pledge was \$560 and we had a participation rate of around 13%. In terms of percentage of participation, we ranked ninth among the 12 parishes in our regional deanery. Most of our area parishes had over 20% participation, with Epiphany Catholic Church at 59% participation and St. Stephen Martyr Catholic Church at 52% participation.

This year, our parish goal is to once again surpass \$300,000, and I am especially interested in improving our participation rate to reach 20%. This latter goal seems easily attainable as even the smallest amount is registered.

Please consider giving to the Cardinal's Appeal and, in doing so, enter the flowing waters that broaden and deepen our Christian community.

SOCIAL JUSTICE Welcome Wendy Torres to Holy Trinity!

On **March 2**, Wendy Torres from Maria Madre de los Pobres, our sister parish in El Salvador, will arrive in D.C. Parishioners will have an opportunity to meet and talk with Wendy over the course of the following week, including at our traditional Lenten simple supper on **March 3**.



Maria Madre has been Holy Trinity's sister parish since 1989. Parishioners go on a delegation every summer where they share in the life and liturgy of the parish. Holy Trinity also supports at-risk children at the parish school called CAPI (Center for Attention and Promotion of Children) through the social justice tithe.

For some perspective on daily life in Maria Madre's neighborhood of La Charca, read this excerpt from a piece Wendy wrote on September 1, 2015 for the blog Millennial:

It's certain that the death of Carlos will not make the news. The media won't cover it, because Carlos's life was one that did not count. He was not born into a "good" family or a renowned neighborhood. His life was not newsworthy. He was, at once, the child of no one and the product of everyone.

Just like the five other people killed in the marginal community of La Charca in the five days leading up to this shooting, Carlos's murder will not make the news. In this community, now home to three different gangs, violence is common—neither the lives nor deaths of anyone in this poor neighborhood are considered newsworthy by anybody. Paradoxically, the media has been reporting a drop in homicides in recent days.
