### Building the Human City: William Lynch's Ignatian Spirituality for Public Life by John F. Kane

At a time when there is so much polarization in our nation and in our world, the thinking of Fr. William Lynch (1908-87) is more important than ever. Using the insights derived from philosophy as well as the Greek classics, Kane sees Lynch as providing ways to see the contemporary world in terms of Apollo, Dionysius and Prometheus. Through the power to "imagine the real" Lynch finds the understandings of faith and irony as a source for unity. While intellectually dense at times, Kane's interpretation of Lynch's writings is rich with insights.—*Kevin Gillespie, S.J., Pastor* 

### Bread of Life, Cup of Salvation by John Baldovin

An excellent primer on the history, practice and theology of the Mass. Baldovin (a Jesuit!) puts the Mass into an historical context that grounds how we celebrate the Mass today. It includes discussion questions at the end of each chapter for your dinner table conversation or book club (wine not included).—David Pennington, Pastoral Associate for Worship & Liturgy

### From the Pastor's Desk

You might call them The Magnificent Seven--the Seven Sacraments, that is. This past and coming month each one of the sacraments is being witnessed at Holy Trinity.

For example, on June 3 at the Saturday Vigil Mass a host of Holy Trinity Parish teenagers will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop Barry Knestout will confirm some 66 of them, while at the Saturday Vigil on June 10, Bishop Mario Dorsonville will confirm another 66. Meanwhile, since Easter Sunday at more than a dozen weekend liturgies, 135 of our children have received their First Holy Communion. The witness of so many of our youth, individually and collectively, is indeed a great grace for the entire parish.

Turning to the other sacraments since Easter, there have been a number of baptisms, some in St. Ignatius Chapel and others sprinkled into the weekend Masses. With the coming of spring, every weekend there have been one or more occasions for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Of course, parishioners have made regular use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday evenings and some parishioners who are ill or about to undergo a serious operation have requested the Sacrament of the Sick. And I am happy to announce that on Saturday morning, June 11 at Fordham University, Brett McLaughlin, the son of parishioners Lori and Tim McLaughlin will be ordained a priest in the Society of Jesus. Congratulations to all recipients and their families!

Each one of the Magnificent Seven represents an opportunity for the recipient as well as we witnesses to be formed by the presence of the Holy Spirit revealed at the first Pentecost. This Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, we commemorate this first occasion and just as importantly celebrate the reverberating signs of the Spirit revealed in and through the Seven Sacraments.

In their own way, the Church's Seven Sacraments magnify God's incarnational presence in our lives. Through signs, symbols, songs and stories, they evoke ways for us to imagine God through life's various phases and passages. Some theologians refer to this as a process of seeking and sensing God's real presence by means of an analogical imagination. While we may not experience God directly, we are invited to do so God analogously.

As we celebrate the Season of Pentecost may our imaginations be stirred by the reception of one of the Magnificent Seven by so many of our parishioners. And may our souls, like Mary the Mother of Jesus, be magnified and made magnanimous in love for one another in the Spirit sent by her Son.
