

Feast Day of St. Ignatius July 31st



July 31st is the feast day of St. Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits and patron Saint of retreats, who passed away 460 years ago on this day in the year 1556. Born in 1491, Ignatius was a different kind of saint. As the noted Jesuit historian Fr. John O'Malley, SJ, observed, "Ignatius redefined the traditional basis of saintliness," which usually involved a degree of unworldliness. In contrast, Fr. O'Malley refers to Ignatius as a "worldly saint." Ignatius made sure that the early Jesuits were spending most of their time in relatively secular spaces such as classrooms — teaching less directly about the Bible and Church doctrine than about literature and the ancient classics. He sent letters to his missionaries asking that they write back not just about their ministries, but also about the local customs, the plants and wild life — "anything that seems extraordinary." Most of all, Ignatius wanted Jesuits to go out and "find God in all things." (Jesuits.org)

From the Pastor's Desk

There is something about the word "pilgrim" that conjures up warm memories and inspired meanings. As a Jesuit I have, over the years, been blessed to have made a half dozen pilgrimages to near and distant lands. Some years ago, while working at Loyola University of Chicago, I attended a fascinating exhibit at the University's Museum of Art titled "Pilgrimage and Faith: Buddhism, Christianity, and Islam." *

The exhibit strengthened my sense that all the major religions incorporate pilgrimages into their religious identity.

It was with enthusiastic curiosity that I joined several dozen parishioners at the monthly Sunday Dinner of the of Trinity Adult Community to listen to one of our parishioners, Kevin Barquinero, describe the pilgrimage he made this past May along the "El Camino." El Camino is a medieval road that stretches more than 500 miles from the French Pyrenees to the shrine of St. James in Santiago, Spain. With engaging humor Kevin recounted his pilgrimage. He spoke eloquently of the physical challenges of his five week walk and also shared a plethora of joyful encounters. He especially noted how he met a host of fellow pilgrims, and by doing so, he sensed the Presence of God along the way. Walking the El Camino, despite its arduous challenges, has a way of revealing such God encounters, as several other parishioners and veteran El Camino pilgrims attested to that evening.

Other members of Holy Trinity have recently engaged on similar pilgrimages. Some have traveled to Fatima and Lourdes, while others have visited Rome. This past April one couple from the parish, Michael and Linda Wiessler-Hughes, journeyed to Jerusalem. They were led by Fr. Brendan Lally, S.J., my former rector at Saint Joseph's University. He had guided me on a similar pilgrimage four years ago. Upon their return I invited Mike and Linda, along with Kevin, to share some of their pilgrimage graces at a weekday 5:30 Mass. As Mike and Linda recounted their grace-filled experiences on the Mount where Jesus proclaimed the Beatitudes, I smiled in recognition that I had too had similar moments of grace.

As the pastor of our Jesuit parish, I foresee hearing more grace-filled stories from other parishioners who have encountered God while on a pilgrimage. How appropriate it will be to hear such stories, for no less a personage than St. Ignatius of Loyola, whose feast we celebrate on July 31st, called himself "The Pilgrim."
