Immigration Reform Offering of Letters

Today during all masses, you will find postcards in the pews asking our elected Representatives and Senators to pass comprehensive, humane immigration reform. The postcards are based on USCCB's advocacy around immigration and ask that Congress provide a path to citizenship for undocumented persons living in this country, preserve family unity, provide legal paths for low-skilled workers to come work in the U.S., restore due process protections to the immigration enforcement process, and address the root causes of migration.

From the Pastor's Desk

Parishioners will have noticed that the Sunday bulletin has been redesigned. It is shorter (8 rather than 12 pages), cleaner, more attractive, and with less text. We hope it is easier to read and a more effective tool to communicate with you.

Parishioners who have used the parish website (www.trinity.org) will have noticed that it too has been completely redesigned. It is cleaner, has much less text, has more photos and live links, and is much more user-friendly.

I give all the credit for these improvements to parishioners who have offered constructive feedback over the past two or three years, and to Courtney Mattison, our parish Director of Communications, and our parish Communications Committee, previously chaired by Marty Kady and currently chaired by Brian Wohlert. Courtney, Marty, Brian, and other Committee members took parishioner feedback seriously and designed a website that responded to parishioner concerns. I think the site is much improved. Check it out. I think you will agree.

I would also like to thank Fr. Sam Sawyer, SJ. His knowledge of programming and website design was extremely helpful as we launched our new website.

Incidentally, we received technical assistance for this effort from a non-profit web design company in Camden, New Jersey, called *Hopeworks*. *Hopeworks* was founded and is directed by Fr. Jeff Putthoff, S.J. It puts atrisk young people to work learning web design and good business practices. Our partnering with *Hopeworks* not only served our parish purposes; it also helped Fr. Jeff continue his good work with the youth of Camden.

We have also re-worked our parish eLetter. Again, we have tried to shorten it and make it more attractive and useful. We want to make the eLetter and other forms of electronic communication our primary way to communicate with parishioners. This sort of electronic communication allows us to remind parishioners quickly, inexpensively, and easily of important upcoming parish events, and to notify them of time-sensitive events such as parishioner deaths and funeral arrangements.

For several weeks now, we have been encouraging parishioners to subscribe to the new eLetter. It is easy to do. Go to the parish website, click on the "subscribe to eLetter" button on the right side of the home page below the photo, and give your name and e-mail address. Then click on the "subscribe" button to activate your subscription.

For those parishioners who had been receiving the old eLetter, we ask you to subscribe to the new eLetter. Your old subscription is not transferable, so if you don't specially subscribe to the new eLetter, you won't get it. Subscribe to the new eLetter in the same way: go to the website; click on the "subscribe to eLetter" button on the homepage; give your name and email address; and click on the "subscribe" button to activate your subscription.

You might also take this opportunity to be sure that we have your current family information, including the names of persons living in your household, your mailing address, your phone number, and, very importantly, your current e-mail address. We know from experience that we don't have an up-to-date e-mail address for as many as 25% of registered parishioners. Let us know by writing us at: communications@trinity.org.

Communications is one of the keys to creating and sustaining a unified community. Helps us stay in touch with you.
