# From the Pastor's Desk

On the cover page of this issue of the parish bulletin we are announcing the upcoming elections to the Parish Pastoral Council. It hardly needs repeating that all parishioners have the right and responsibility to participate fully in the life of the parish, and many of you parishioners will find yourselves specially qualified to serve in parish leadership positions, including on the Council.

The call to lay persons to participate in the life of the Church is nothing new. For its part, the Society of Jesus has been encouraging lay women and men to join Jesuits in directing the Society's apostolic works for more than fifty years. More recently, the Society, in its 1995 Decree, *Cooperation with the Laity in Mission*, declared that all those persons who are connected with a Jesuit work, like Holy Trinity parish, "should exercise co-responsibility (with Jesuits) and be engaged in discernment and participate in decision-making where it is appropriate." The Society made clear its own responsibility to properly prepare its lay colleagues for leadership ministry: "Lay persons must have access to and be trained to positions of responsibility according to their qualifications and commitment." In other words, lay persons are invited to be genuine partners with Jesuits in directing Jesuit works, and Jesuits in turn are expected to provide the necessary formation to these persons so that their contribution to the work is meaningful and helpful.

At Holy Trinity, lay persons have many opportunities to be in genuine partnership with Jesuits in guiding the parish. One such opportunity is service on the Parish Pastoral Council. The Council has recently affirmed that the Council, along with the pastor, leads this particular community of companions of Jesus that is Holy Trinity parish. Council members, as advisors to the pastor, share responsibility with him for discerning, articulating, and communicating to other parishioners the specifically Catholic and Jesuit identity and mission of the parish, and assist him in assuring fidelity to that identity and mission.

This is a specialized and demanding service to the parish, one that requires a profound commitment to the well-being of the parish, active engagement in the life of the parish, an ability to think strategically, and a heart always open to what is for the greater good of the parish. Service on the Council presumes a willingness to grow in understanding of what the Society of Jesus expects of its parishes. It presumes a commitment to the Society's mission, and a willingness to learn and to practice distinctively Jesuit ways of decision—making.

Although all parishioners are called by virtue of their baptism to participate in the life of the community, not all parishioners will hear a call to service as members of the Parish Pastoral Council. But those who do discern a call to this form of service will be offering Holy Trinity and the Society of Jesus a great gift.

I encourage all parishioners to go to the Holy Trinity website (www.trinity.org – About Us – Parish Pastoral Council – General Information). Review the document, "Re-Envisioning the Holy Trinity Parish Pastoral Council," which the Council adopted unanimously on April 8, 2015. Consider what that document says about the identity and role of the Council and its ordinary way of proceeding. Consider the qualities of effective Council members and the expectations the parish has of Council members. Assess your own fitness to serve the parish in this way. Then pray. If you are feeling a call to parish leadership, and if you would like to run for election to the Council later this month, email Council members Meredith MacKenzie (meredith.mackenzie@gmail.com) or Kirk Willison (kirkwillison@gmail.com). Meredith or Kirk will answer your questions and explain next steps.

# Ignatian Formation Program: Becoming Spiritual Directors or Spiritual Companions

The program will provide structure, content, mentoring and supervision to individuals who discerned a call to the ministry of spiritual direction or spiritual companioning. Spiritual Directors are called to guide individuals who are seeking ongoing orientation, encouragement, and discernment in the life of the



Spirit. Spiritual Companions are called to accompany men and women for a short time as they discover, develop, and deepen an intentional relationship with God, such as individuals who are in recovery from addictions and homelessness.

The program will be facilitated by Father Brian McDermott, SJ, Special Assistant to the President of Georgetown University, Martina O'Shea, Pastoral Associate for Ignatian Spirituality and Prayer at Holy Trinity Parish & other trained Ignatian colleagues.
