


Liturgy & Music




Q13 - Holy Trinity Bulletin — Do you read the weekly Bulletin?

Q14 - How do you read the bulletin?






Q15 - What bulletin content is most important to you? (Please select all that apply)



Q21 - What content would you like to receive through social media? (Please select all that apply)










Online Giving Issues


Q28 - What is your impression of Holy Trinity's current financial status?

1. Music is terrible. With a church our size how can we only have 1 good cantor (dark haired woman). 9am choir you can't even hear. Very disappointing. 2. Semons. Remember your audience! 9am is families. Going in depth about Church philosophy doesn't engage the listeners at those masses! We want people to listen + learn! Best are Fathers Kelley + O'Brien—they teach + people listen. Hawlsey reads his w/ the poor acoustics we hear mumbles. 3. Acoustics are miserable + it detracts from Mass. 4. Celebratory 225 is ridiculous. Waste of time + \$.1 feel it silly + wasteful to spend time celebrating 225 years. 200 or 250 ok, but 225? \$ + time could be put to better use. 5. Presider schedule is often put up late (after start of new schedule). It's a PDF, how hard can that be?! Many complain about this. Many choose the Mass by presider. 6. HT has made First Communions not special. Each child should feel special + the day will be imprinted on their hearts. Sermons can remind all present of what communion is all about. Please make sure we acknowledge and address the Catholic Church scandal and response of local, national and international leadership. HT needs to be a leader. I am a committed parishioner but need to see HT take charge and be brave...if not us...who?

Why is church closed for Summer?? What is being done? Why is the renovation such a secret??? Why are parishioners not informed??? Who is to judge how/why this reconstruction is necessary? It must cost ... but why? for what? Does the parish council & pastor think we don't care?

We can be a very difficult group of people to lead- much less minister to. We need a lot of help with listening-listening sessions made that clear to me. Father William Kelley homely this Sunday, June 9, 2019 was outstanding. Good sermons are the reason I attend Holy Trinity.

Holy Trinity is a gem. I have been a parishioner for about five years and as far as I'm concerned the pastor, the associates, and the staff are absolutely outstanding. I wish we didn't change the part right before the communion - we used to kneel, now we all stand... it confuses guests, and I think kneeling shows more respect. Not that easy to find info in website. For example, I thought there would be information on Parish Pastoral candidates by now & an opportunity to vote, but I couldn't find any info online. I love HT's focus on social justice issues, I hope we keep it up. The YAC group is very active and inclusive and organized.

I love HT and searched for 2 years after I moved to Northern VA to find HT. I travel over 40 miles each way but would not go any where else. It is a loving, inclusive, responsible, welcoming and giving parish and parishioners. I am very committed to HT because of the love I find there. I look for ways to give back to HT because of all I have found there. HT does so many things right but one area as an opportunity for improvement in my opinion is the music ministry. The new organist is a genius and a treasure for us but the cantors are not professional nor seem to have the ability to lead the people in worship. That is a unique skill and talent. Not just anyone can do this. In addition, the congregation does not relate (nor sing) to the choice os music particularly at hte 1130 mass. Finally, the choir(s) are weak. I know they are proud of themselves but from the congregation, they can barely be heard and seem unpracticed. It seems they would benefit from a stronger leader.

1. The sexual abuse scandals are not new. To avoid future scandals we need to confront the anachronistic nature of some key Church institutions and consider how misguided leadership over decades produced the current crisis. 2. HTCC might undertake more active outreach to people who do not attend church, especially those raised as Catholics, to let them know that they are welcome in our parish, and help them distinguish the Catholic faith from the actions of some incompetent Church officials. This could also help us deepen our faith and find ways to reverse the Church's decline.

I like it when the masses and missions are to help all people. I've been to churches that help to make their institution look good and not just for the sake of helping others, please do not go down this path.

I would appreciate seeing photos of the priests who regularly celebrate Sunday masses on the website. It would help me to put names to their faces. Maybe even administrative staff photos?

I am grateful for the work of all of the staff of HT. It can't be an easy job :-). Please know that you are appreciated.

I wish the homilies would be more practical about how we can live good Catholic lives in the world and less paeans to social justice and complaints about the sexual abuse crisis. Yes, that matters, but it's not the whole faith. I also think the parish does a terrible job of integrating families who don't have kids at the school. It is incredibly cliquey, even though it's all about "all are welcome." I sometimes think that it's easier to be transgender at Trinity than be a family without kids at the school—at least there's a ministry if you're the former. But if you're the latter, you're often stuck with coffee and donuts at which all the school parents talk to each other and don't seem to want to meet new people.

Often the Bulletin is information overload. I wonder if simplifying (and shortening) might make it more purposeful? If HT is struggling financially I would think there is a connection to the larger institutional Church- people do not give as much to ministries that they do not trust. The sexual abuse crisis - and the perceived slow response is hurtful to all Catholics.

As a new parishoner, there's a lot that people assume we know. There's a lot of insider language and knowledge, from where the bathrooms with the changing tables are to the difference between the hall and where donuts are served, which is apparently not the hall

9:00 family Mass can be more welcoming to regular attendees who do not have children. Homilies should be directed to more than kids and their parents. The term "children" or "kids" should be used instead of "boys and girls." They may be there with parents, grandparents, foster parents, or other guardians. Non-parent adults also attend Mass, as do other parents who have grown children who are not there. Additional language sensitivity is needed so many are not excluded.

Do whatever you have to do to keep David Pennington at Holy Trinity! You have no idea how lucky we are!

Ask this question: Do you reach out and introduce yourself to an unfamiliar face after Mass or other parish activity? When? Where? How often? This is a very thoughtful questionnaire, but not too valuable unless lots of parishioners participate. Perhaps this opportunity should be promulgated more vigorously?

I think we do not recognize the importance of Sunday to the average parishioner and the average person looking for a faith home. This is the main communication to individuals and their main experience of the Catholic Christian church.

More events that specifically invite single parishioners to join families and the larger community

In mu opinion the atmosphere or climate of HTC is very positive and engaging. I enjoy Mass services on Sunday and during the week. As a single, senior citizen I have less energy and financial resources to engage in many of the available HTC activities. St. Ignatius, I believe, would be very happy with HTC, the parishioners, the school, and the priests who serve the parish so well.

The priests need to get more involved with the children as they are the future of the Church. Do not pile more responsibilities on the parents especially for Confirmation as this turns of the candidates. Too much is given that was not required previously to become confirmed which involves the parents, candidates are not looking for more time with their parents and I guess the priests don't understand as they don't have children. Let candidates serve as future adults in the Church without their parents and confirmation should be in the Fall of 8th grade as 8th are too busy to have more piled on. First communions need to be mostly limited to two or three group settings not every Mass after Easter

As I stated in an earlier comment, since Fr. Mark left I have not felt like this is my parish. I love the Jesuits but this emphasis on rushing and not taking the time to greet and make all welcome. Fr. Ryan is another who I miss because his homely were both educational and I always left the Mass feeling that I learned something.

Announce special collections in advance in all means available. This is rarely done. Funding must surely be lost because people are surprised and either give less or not at all.






Q31 - Gender




Q32 - Age
