COLUMBARIUM NICHE PRICING

All are welcome. You do not need to be a Catholic to purchase entombment rights in a niche at Holy Trinity Columbarium. Purchasers can select a preferred niche location based on availability at the time of purchase.

Each Wall or Crypt niche comes with two bronze urns. The urns will fit in the niche, one in front of the other. Each urn provided is: 5.5" width x 5.5" depth x 7" height. If you prefer to use other urns, the interior dimensions of the niches are:

- Wall niche: 11.5" width x 11.75" depth x 10.5" height.
- Crypt niche: 7.5" width x 11.75" depth x 6.5" height.

HOLY TRINITY COLUMBARIUM

A Sacred Place of Final Repose in a Restored Cemetery

Holy Trinity Catholic Church has recently restored and relandscaped Holy Rood Cemetery, a sacred space on a hilltop overlooking Georgetown.

As part of this project, Holy Trinity has built a 645-niche columbarium there for parishioners and others.



AN HISTORIC CEMETERY

The Jesuits who established Georgetown University founded Holy Trinity Church in 1794. Holy Trinity established Holy Rood, its 6.5-acre parish cemetery, in 1832. The University still owns the cemetery.

There are more than 7,000 burials of parishioners and others at Holy Rood. The last available plot there was sold in 1915, and Holy Rood was closed for burials in the 1990s.

RESTORING HOLY ROOD

In 2018, Holy Trinity Church and Georgetown University agreed on a plan to restore Holy Rood Cemetery, and to grant Holy Trinity the right to build a 645-niche columbarium there. The project was completed in the spring of 2020.

Holy Trinity has already sold entombment rights in a substantial number of niches in the new columbarium. It is using a portion of the proceeds of columbarium niche sales to fund a Perpetual Care Endowment for Holy Rood Cemetery. Georgetown University and Holy Trinity have established a Joint Management Committee to ensure the good upkeep of the restored cemetery.

THE COLUMBARIUM

Holy Trinity Columbarium consists of two unique structures.

An existing brownstone hillside Crypt has been restored and now contains 99 columbarium niches.





A new curved granite columbarium Wall, containing 546 niches, has been built in the historic carriage-way opposite the Crypt.
