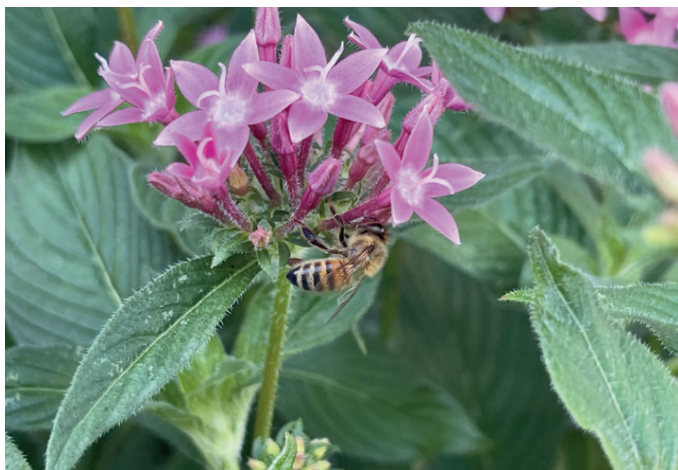

The Holy Trinity Gardens: 20 Years in the Making

The current Holy Trinity gardens have been 20 years in the making. While the Chapel Gardens themselves began the transformation 23 years ago, even those have been completely redesigned in conjunction with the work to shore up and waterproof the raised beds found to the east of the Chapel of St. Ignatius.

Each year, much tender care goes into planning, planting, weeding, dividing, buying and raising money for these cherished gardens in order to create prayerful and an uplifting space for our community — and not to mention a fantastic photo opportunity for weddings and baptisms. These efforts are led by our Garden Ministry, which any parishioner is welcome to join and support.

Much work has been done to reimagine garden beds with seasonal interest every month. Initially, some of these spaces housed concrete hopscotch pads and rotting tree ties laid beneath failing trees and sparse grass. Perennials — plants

which return every year — have been chosen where suited and annuals have been used sparingly, which helps save costs. Every spring, the grounds welcome parishioners, visitors and students with daffodils in every corner. In winter, there are berries and red twig hydrangeas along with evergreens and a structural Harry Lauder “walking stick” shrub.

The microclimate in the East Garden nurtures sun-loving plants like roses, rosemary and lavender all the way into December. In spring, there is a plethora of peonies and coral bells among other blooms and blossoms. The parish rotund has a spectacular view of a profusely blooming Camilla from the large window.

In addition to seasonal updates, longer projects in the past 20 years have transformed every space on our block. In front of the school buildings, new walkways with wheelchair access were added along with a butterfly garden for educational use. Students can also now enjoy a bit of shade during recess as trees were planted along N Street, which soften the block with its tall brick buildings and tree guards to protect them from harm.

In years to come, these trees will not only help lower cooling costs for our campus, but also help the well-being of our students and all those in our neighborhood by reducing carbon dioxide. Most of the sidewalk tree beds have had the old ties removed and iron guards installed, and new trees have been installed in an effort to plant the areas with moisture and soil retaining flowers and perennials, which is good for erosion, birds, and bees.

Additional changes include the front of the rectory, which was refreshed with smaller and blooming shrubs to open up the access to the stairs and add color on that shady side of the street. In the back of the rectory, Holy Trinity School students and parents have started a vegetable garden to learn more about fruits, vegetables and sustainability. Planters were also added to the corridor between the school and church to brighten and soften the path to McKenna Hall.

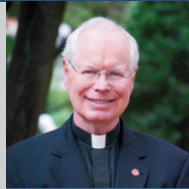

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Since May 20 of this year until July 31 of next year, we are commemorating the Ignatian year, the focus of which is "to see all things new in Christ." This theme was wonderfully manifested by parishioners last week — in addition to celebrations of the Rite of Baptism and Weddings, our Religious Education program resumed with more than 400 children, ages 5 to 14, participating. Regrettably, due to COVID restrictions, we are not able to have in-person Religious Education classes nor have the 9:00am Children's Mass in Trinity Hall. Participation in the catechetical classes was by Zoom.

Also, this past weekend, parishioners offered an example of a compassionate community when our Migrant Team commemorated World Day of Migrants and Refugees by hosting our 11 refugees and asylum seekers and some members of their families. Besides having an opportunity to meet some of the refugees, parishioners were invited to support our parish's efforts to help them. For example, dozens of delicious boxes of homemade jambalaya were sold as well as cookies courtesy of our sixth graders from our school. We raised \$2,571 for our Migrant program and our St. Jean Baptiste Sister Parish in Haiti. Thank you.

This past Monday the parish sponsored two important interviews. The Women Who Stay series sponsored a Zoom presentation by Germaine Little Bear from the Diocese of Rapid City. Later that evening our Holy Trinity Green Team hosted Fr. Gael Giraud, S.J., Ph.D., a world renowned climatologist and the director of Georgetown University's new Institute for Environmental Justice. Several dozen parishioners were amazed at his presentation in which he graphically demonstrated the serious nature of the environmental forecasts for the detrimental changes facing our planet's shrinking land masses, lessening mineral deposits, rising temperatures and reduced drinkable water. The video of both Germaine Little Bear and Fr. Giraud's presentations are available on our social justice website.

Looking ahead, there are several important events on the immediate and distant horizon. This coming week we host Cardinal Wilton Gregory for an 11:00am Mass in the church on Tuesday, October 6. Following this Mass, Cardinal Gregory will bless a statue titled, "When I was Hungry..." sculpted by the renowned international sculpture Timothy Schmalz. This beautiful sculpture is based on the passage from Matthew 25. We are fortunate to receive this sculpture as a gift from Mr. Tim Needles, who will also be in attendance. All are invited.

Also, on Sunday, October 17 from 10:15-11:15am we will launch our Youth Ministry program for Holy Trinity high school students. Our hope is to offer formative readings, discussions, local religious excursions and service projects for our youth. Students and/or their parents may inquire by contacting Anne Marie Kaufman, our new Director of Religious Education.

Finally, as part of the Ignatian Year, we have begun to plan two Ignatian pilgrimages for this coming spring. One pilgrimage will be a bus tour of the early Jesuit churches and sites in southern Maryland. Another pilgrimage will involve visiting some of the more significant places of Ignatius life in Spain and Rome. This international pilgrimage will take place from March 22-30 and will include visits to Loyola, Navarone, Manresa, Montserrat, Barcelona and Rome.
