### Reconciling God, Creation and Humanity An Ignatian Examen

The Season of Creation is a month-long prayerful observance that calls upon Catholics to pray and care for God's Creation. It starts September 1st and ends October 4th. It's a time of reflection on our relationship with the environment, how we live, and how our lifestyles impact the natural world, humans and other creatures inhabiting it. This is a time of restoration and of hope, but also a time for action. It's a time we can take to educate ourselves on new ways of living with Creation that better care for both people and the planet. It's a time to craft plans and implement those changes. What changes will you make as an individual to contribute to a more just and sustainable future? Have you considered joining your parish Green Team? Consider reading the encyclical Laudato Si', a great source of inspiration and motivation. As Pope Francis said, "this is the season for letting our prayer be inspired anew," a season "to reflect on our lifestyles," and a season "for undertaking prophetic actions . . . calling for courageous decisions . . . directing the planet towards life, not death.'

This Ecological Examen (ecologicalexamen.org) provided by the Ignatian Solidarity Network is a tool for prayer, reflection and action as individuals in their home, parish, school,

university or community deepen our call to care for creation and the most vulnerable.

- 1. I give thanks to God for creation and for being wonderfully made. Where did I feel God's presence in creation today?
- 2. I ask for the grace to see creation as God does in all its splendor and suffering. Do I see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the poor?
- 3. I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable. What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation? How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead stand in solidarity with creation and the poor?
- 4. I ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation. Where have I fallen short in caring for creation and my brothers and sisters? How do I ask for a conversion of heart?
- 5. I ask for the grace to reconcile my relationship with God, creation and humanity, and to stand in solidarity through my actions. How can I repair my relationship with creation and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?
- 6. I offer a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable in our society.\$

# ACCOMPANY ONE ANOTHER TO JERUSALEM

Summer has flown by, and here, at the start of September, a feeling of change is in the air. Young children return to school; high school graduates set out for college—and liturgical changes are afoot, too.

Two weeks ago, Jesus began making his way to Jerusalem and the Cross. This moment thus marks a pivotal point in the liturgical year. We observed this change of direction and focus by singing "Jerusalem, My Destiny," describing in song our journey to Jerusalem alongside Jesus, followed by "Be My Hands and Feet," praying about our life of discipleship and care as we become Christ for the world. We also changed our Eucharistic Acclamations to the LAND OF REST setting. We will sing these acclamations until the First Sunday of Advent. These musical changes reflect our change of direction as we accompany Jesus to his death and resurrection.

Just as we choose to walk alongside Jesus at this bittersweet time of change, we can choose to be newly present to one another during Mass. As Ministers of the Assembly, we can sing to surround all members of the Body of Christ with our voice and affirm our choice to be an active participant in this liturgical pilgrimage. As always, our song texts during this season will be prayers of praise, gratitude, unity, social justice, mission, comfort, ministry and love. As you arrive for Mass, check the worship aid and look over the prayers we will be singing. Remembereven if you don't think you have a great voice, just return to God the voice He gave you. He knows what it sounds like and He is OK with it! Plus, when we all sing as one, we are not individuals, but the ONE voice of the Body of Christ.

Another way to renew our liturgical fellowship is to check the worship aid each weekend for the list of the following Sunday's readings. You can take a picture of the citations and prepare by reading and reflecting on those readings throughout the week. This practice of Lectio Divina, "sacred reading," will help you to break open the readings and be ready for the homily and musical prayer each Sunday.

Finally, September is also a good time to consider sharing your gifts of time, treasure and talent. Why not give Music Ministry a try? Holy Trinity has many choirs for you to choose from: from the newly forming St. Ignatius Youth Singers, to the 5:30 Sunday Ensemble, to the 11:30 Ignatian Choir, and more. All choirs are looking for new singers and instrumentalists.

With change in the air as we turn toward Jerusalem with Jesus, let us keep in mind the Gospel mission to which we are called.

And keep singing along the way:."I have fixed my eyes on your hills, Jerusalem, my destiny..."




