September is Back to Work for the Parish Pastoral Council

As a new academic year begins, so does the year for the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). This month, our current group of twelve elected members begin another year of working closely with our Pastor, the committees and ministries, the parish staff, the school, and you, Holy Trinity's parishioners. While we don't know exactly what the year will bring, I want to share a bit about what we hope to focus on.

Last year, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) focused on the parish level efforts to participate in the Synod on Synodality. Many of you joined one of our eight listening sessions or responded to our survey so that the PPC could provide answers to the questions posed by the Archdiocese of Washington, the USCCB, and the Vatican. Your participation was thoughtful, prayerful, and generous and helped us to prepare a thorough report for the Archdiocese. This summer, the Archdiocese released its report synthesizing the listening sessions that occurred in parishes across DC and five Maryland counties.

As we await the efforts of the larger church this coming year, the PPC will continue reflect on the prayerful and thoughtful feedback you provided in the report, particularly comments specific to Holy Trinity itself, and ensure it is a part of our decision-making, advising, and potential action we recommend.

This year, the PPC will also provide opportunities for you to give additional feedback and reflections, as many of you requested. And we always welcome you to attend a meeting (typically the third Wednesday of the month) to listen in or share your thoughts. All PPC meetings are open to any parishioner, in person or by Zoom. Check the bulletin monthly for the specific date, time, and location.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It is good to be back at Holy Trinity! As many of you know, for the past two months I have been away from the parish on a "summer sabbatical." Besides experiencing rest and relaxation, the sabbatical offered me a time to rejuvenate my energies.

From July 1 until September 1, I visited a dozen or so locations in Wales, Ireland, İtaly, as well as cities such as Chicago, Minneapolis and Virgin Beach. It was a time to connect and reconnect with family and friends and to make new friends. In so many ways God's graces abounded.

Wales was the first destination, and it was there that I enjoyed a one week retreat at St. Beuno's. How easy it was to pray within the awesome beauty of the Welsh landscape. Looking up at the bright blue skies and gazing at the peaceful herds of cattle and sheep, I could readily sense the presence of the Jesuit poet Gerard Manely Hopkins who wrote some of his finest poems gazing at the same landscapes.

Following my retreat I headed to Ireland, where in County Donegal I visited my first cousins. How moving it was to share with them how my parents as teenagers left their families and came to America where their dreams of family and faith were fulfilled.

Italy was the third foreign country I visited. Through the generosity of two Holy Trinity parishioners I spent a week enjoying the magnificent beauty of Tuscany. There I visited several churches and museums in towns such as Assisi, Florence and Siena. What profound graces I received when we visited the historic remains of St. Francis and St. Clare and saw the magnificent works of Brunelleschi, Da Vinci, Donatello, Fra Angelico, Michelangelo and so many artists of the Renaissance.

Then this past week I visited the Benedictine Monastery and the Ecumenical Institute at St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota. How delightful it was to return to the residence where some twenty years ago I had spent a semester writing a book while praying with the Benedictine community.

While in Minnesota I also took the opportunity to visit 37th and Chicago Avenue where a memorial to George Floyd has been constructed. While reflecting at that tragic site I met and spoke with Ms. Angela Harrleson, an aunt of the victim. It was quite moving to speak with her, not only about the trauma she and her family have endured over her nephew's horrific death, but the hopes she had for racial justice and reconciliation grounded in faith and love.

Finally, I should also mention another experience which did not involve traveling abroad. It happened right here in Washington, D.C. when Father Arthur Sosa, S.J., the General of the Society of Jesus, visited Washington to meet and speak with area leaders of our Jesuit institutions. All in all it was a fantastic two months, but I am glad that I have been able to return to you, the fabulous parishioners of Holy Trinity.

Information Sessions on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola September 24






