Caring for Our Buildings by Thomas Favret, Managing Director of Parish Operations

Summer is often a quieter time at Holy Trinity, but this year our facilities team was busy making important upgrades around the campus. Drawing on reserve funds and working closely with the parish facilities committee, headed by Maureen McAvey, we made some long overdue repairs.

Most visible may have been the scaffolding around the church and Chapel of St. Ignatius. The exterior windows and wood supporting the roofs had not been painted in decades, evidenced by extensive wood rot and peeling paint! The iconic bell tower of the chapel also had serious damage. Week after week, carpenters and painters restored these hallowed buildings to pristine condition, making them fit for another generation.

Our historic church organ, acquired from the Library of Congress, suffered greatly from high humidity during the start of COVID (when windows and doors were opened) and by months of idleness during the pandemic. When the congregation returned, the air handling system struggled to maintain the proper humidity for the organ - while making the church too cold for the congregation to bear. After making a necessary electrical upgrade, we installed a duct heater to maintain proper humidity and temperature, while ensuring the long-term health and magnificent sound of our organ.

The Parish Center and Faber Annex were constructed in 2000, and the aging roofs of both buildings had begun to leak and needed replacement. We took this opportunity to replace the black tar roof material, which absorbs heat, with white thermoplastic polyolefin (TPO) roof material that reflects up to 90% of the sun's rays, significantly reducing the need for air-conditioning. That, coupled with our upcoming solar panels, LED light replacement and other initiatives, make Holy Trinity "greener" than ever!

At the same time, the sacristy and first and second-floor officers received a makeover, with fresh paint and new carpeting.! With these improvements, we continue the work of those before us.

LIVING OUR MISSION

The Body of Christ

A couple of weeks ago, during the 11:30am Sunday Mass, Fr. Brian McDermott, SJ, had just finished giving communion to the Eucharistic ministers and had moved to the front of the center aisle. The choir began to sing *From the Many, Make Us One* as the people in the first row approached Fr. McDermott to receive the host. "The body of Christ," Fr. McDermott said. I briefly wondered how I could hear him from my seat half way back on the side. Then I realized he had left his lavalier microphone on, and it was picking up his every word.

"The body of Christ," he said, over a "hot" mike.

"Hhm," I mused to myself, "I wonder if someone will tell him?"

"The body of Christ," he said.

"When we sing and when we cry," sang the assembly with the choir, "as we live and as we d..."

"The body of Christ," said Fr. McDermott.

Well, it was only a little bit distracting, so I got back to singing and waiting for my turn to stand and join the procession.

"The body of Christ."

The song continued, "This our great procession line," and just as the next line "To this table now we come," started, Fr. McDermott said again, giving the host to the next person, "the body of Christ." And as we sang, "from the many make us one," again, "the body of Christ."

Finally, it sunk in, and I looked around the church like I hadn't in a while. Here we were, the body of Christ, receiving the body of Christ! I saw members of the LGBTQIA+ Ministry a few rows away. I saw some of the Coffee & Donut Ministry volunteers. There were a few young adults, and some families with children. Folks who are part of the 50+ Ministry sitting near members of the Migrant Team. And I thought of a longtime 11:30 lector who recently died.

"Walk with all who walked before," sang the choir.

"The body of Christ," said Fr. McDermott.

St. Augustine, writing about the Eucharist in the liturgy, said, "Behold who you are. Become what you receive."

God gifted me in that moment, knocking me out of my complacency to glimpse my fellow parishioners and myself profoundly as we truly are – and as we are invited to become. Transformed by the Eucharist, we can transform the world. It's an energizing thought – and a deep responsibility to be the body of Christ for others *today*.

I savored that moment, knowing how the challenges of parish life can obscure the vision I saw. And I've stored it in my memory to be called upon when I need a reminder of how beautiful we are: the body of Christ.


LGBTQIA+ MINISTRY




