#### From the Pastor's Desk

Recently in this column, Father Bill O'Neill explained aspects of his work with refugees in Kenya and his ministry with the Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS). This international organization defines its mission as "to accompany, serve, and advocate on behalf of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons, that they may heal, learn, and determine their own future." The JRS mission reflects the ways in which the Catholic Church has prioritized outreach to refugees.

As the website of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) notes: "The Catholic Church in the United States is an immigrant Church with a long history of embracing diverse newcomers and providing assistance and pastoral care to immigrants, migrants, refugees, and people on the move." Holy Trinity Church has responded to Christ's call for us to "welcome the stranger among us," for in this encounter with the immigrant, the migrant, and the refugee in our midst, we encounter Christ.

Through the generosity of our parishioners and the talents of more than 50 volunteers, Holy Trinity has shared in the mission of JRS and the USCCB. This Saturday, December 10, the parish will host our third annual Mass for Migrants. Coinciding with the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Mass (proclaimed in Spanish) brings together the families, our Migrant Team, and a host of supportive parishioners. Presently we are supporting thirteen households and are in touch with seven others who have "graduated" from our sponsorship. They are the following:

As noted on our website, the HT Migrant Team/Migrant Familia has been accompanying and advocating for refugees since 2017 when we welcomed the Cheikho family from Syria. Over 84 million people are forcibly displaced around the world, and our

Migrant Familia stands ready to welcome and accompany these mothers, fathers, sisters, brothers, daughters and sons as they seek refuge in our community.

Our Migrant Team comprises 50+ volunteers addressing education, healthcare, legal, transportation, employment and food insecurity each week. Their leadership includes the following parishioners: Jeanne Rossomme, Mary Gibbons, John Brain (Migrant Team Leads); Geri Fitzgerald, Mary McCabe (Health Care); Patti Franco, Kitty Wach (Legal); Mike Conway, Mary Lou Hartman (Transportation); Ash Hawken, Kathy Lankford, Colleen Conroy (Food insecurity) and many more who tutor, problem solve and mentor.

During this Sacred Season of Advent as we move closer toward celebrating the birthday of Jesus Christ may we respond generously to our parish refugees and all strangers who need our assistance locally and globally and may we recognize Christ in them. They indeed illuminate the Presence of God among us.


## CHRISTMAS CAROLING IN GEORGETOWN MONDAY. DECEMBER 12 — 6:30 PM

#### Ann Marie Becraft - Pathmaker

"Ann Marie Becraft (1805-34), a path-breaking African American educator in Georgetown and early member of the Oblate Sisters of Providence in Baltimore, was the eldest child of William (1778-1860) and Sarah McDaniel (or McDonald) Becraft (1790-1866).

...In 2017, the oldest building on the Georgetown campus was renamed Becraft Hall to honor this extraordinary woman, "one of the foremothers of social activism in Black Washington." It was previously named for Fr. William McSherry, S.J., Jesuit Provincial and Georgetown president (1837-39) who oversaw the mass sale of 272 enslaved people from Jesuit farms in Maryland to three plantations in Louisiana."


