### An Update From The Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is back together for another year. As part of our commitment to be transparent with our faith community, I want to share a preview of the Council's efforts as the year begins.

As the Synod on Synodality continues its initial weeks in Rome, we as a council are taking the time to continue reflecting on everything shared during the parish Synod process nearly 18 months ago. That feedback has been instrumental in guiding growth throughout the parish.

One direct result of that feedback is the institution of two new youth representatives on the council. Kana Wash and Julien Poimboeuf - two of Trinity's high school youth ministry members - are our first representatives. They will serve for one year as non-voting members of the council but will be present for most of what full council members do.

I hope you will join me in thanking Kana and Julien for stepping up to the call to serve on our council, especially as the inaugural individuals. We are grateful to have their voices and perspectives as a part of our regular discussion and I hope they will be able to share their own insights on the experience in the months to come.

Another aspect of the council's work is our involvement in the parish's standing committees, which fall under the purview of the PPC. In addition to attending the full committee meeting each month, PPC members are also assigned to one of the 10 committees to act as the Council's representative as well as a full member of the committee. A note from Angie Bradshaw, a mother of three Holy Trinity School graduates:

I have spent most of my years as a parent trying to determine if I'm doing a good job. As a parent am I underperforming, meeting or exceeding expectations?
