Voices From Our Sister Parish, St. Jean Baptiste in Ansdeno, Haiti

The first in a series of interviews – this week, with Mike Conway By Kathleen Kaye, SJB Committee co-Chair

Mike, What Drew You to Haiti?

As a member of the Social Justice Committee, in 2011, I heard a report from Kittie Fitzgerald following her trip to our sister parish in Haiti, just one year post earthquake. Since retiring, I had been traveling to some far-flung places: Philippines, China, Mongolia and El Salvador. As I heard more about Haiti, I said to myself, "I can do this" and I was IN. I have traveled to Haiti 6 times. Since 2019, it has been unsafe to do so.

What is A Sustaining Image of Ansdeno and the Haitian People?

There are many snapshots of our time in Ansdeno, although, I think what stands out were the two summers

when I traveled to our Sister Parish to assist Haitians and HT parishioners, Harry Gray and Sophia Guerrier to coordinate a youth soccer camp. While in the States, I had secured soccer balls and equipment for use at the camp. All was in order, until the program had to be relocated to another field, not convenient to Ansdeno.

Transporting everyone became a challenge. But the ever-resourceful Haitians found an open-bed truck to bring the boys and girls back and forth to the field. With great glee, enthusiastic singing and youthful energy, 50 kids jumped onto the truck and headed to the soccer field. The educator part of me was worried about permission slips, liability, and lack of safety standards (read: NO seatbelts. There weren't even any seats!) The whole thing was set in motion by Pere Medard, the Pastor at St. Jean Baptiste and then things just kind of happened. By the second year, we increased participation from 150 to almost 250 girls and boys.



Mike, Did You Have An Embarrassing Moment on Your Visits?

Haiti kind of turned my life upside down. The realization of how much I am a person of privilege was a humbling experience. I wouldn't say that I had an embarrassing moment, but more like a "WOW!" moment where I could not believe the extent of the poverty. I had been to Holy Trinity's sister parish, Maria Madre in El Salvador, but was not prepared for what I saw in Haiti.

My first night in Port au Prince, we stayed at Matthew 25, a hospitality center with an armed guard. The rooms upstairs overlooked a field, which just a year before was a tent city housing the homeless and injured, due to the 2010 earthquake. Matthew 25 had been used as a hospital, in the aftermath of the earthquake. The dining room had been an operating room, with surgery done on the dining table. It was hard to process that I was actually in Haiti. I kept asking myself, how can this be...so close to the U.S., so close to where I live?



When you Stayed at the Rectory, What Was It Like Not To Have Running Water and Electricity?

Staying healthy was a focus. I didn't want to get malaria, so there was a big performance every night, getting into bed under a protective mosquito net. Sleep was a pattern of regular interruptions; dogs barking at night, roosters every morning before the light. Eventually I was using ear plugs.

"Showering" was basically throwing water over myself.

Mostly trying to freshen up, to rinse away the brutal heat of the day. The water came from a barrel in the rectory, which in the early days of our visits, was filled with water from a well, three miles down a dirt road. The reality of being a person of privilege was with me every day and with every shower!! My mantra was to just go with the flow.

How Are You Able to Stay Connected With Our Sister Parish These Past Years Where Gang Violence Has Kept Us From Visiting?

I have been involved in the St. Jean Baptiste (SJB) Scholarship Fund since it was founded in 2016. With the generous support of Holy Trinity parishioners, we have been able to grow this program. Beginning with the class of 2016, we have offered 50 students the opportunity to attend a range of post-secondary schools, tuition-free. Students are earning degrees in teaching, nursing, agronomy, law, and engineering.

Presently, 3 of our scholarship students have requested to come to the U.S. as part of the Biden-sponsored Humanitarian Parole Program. My dream is to have a photograph of us together in front of Holy Trinity Church.

Mike, How Are You Changed From Having Been To Haiti?

The more time I spent on the soccer field, in the rectory, walking the dirt streets, I realized that everybody is just trying to live their lives, raise their families, whether you're in Ansdeno or Washington D.C., living out their lives, the life you are given. Bloom where you're planted and revere the lives of others. I was glad to be there and I pray that once again Haiti will be safe, and safe to visit.
