- For more than 40 years, *Path Forward* (formerly A-SPAN) has been the primary program in Arlington providing street outreach, health services, housing, nursing, a day program and other direct services to the unhoused across the county.
- Casa Chirilagua serves the "Chirilagua" neighborhood in Alexandria, where 70% percent of the population is comprised of central American immigrant families (primarily from El Salvador, Honduras, and Guatemala). This faith-based Christian program serves

more than 100 families through community, mentoring, social development and education programs.

- The volunteer-run, interfaith *Culmore Clinic* is based in Bailey's Crossroads and provides health care to low-income adults at little or no cost. The community has a 97% immigrant population and 57% are uninsured.
- *Kitchen of Purpose*, located in Arlington, is leading an innovative approach to advancing socioeconomic change in low-income communities by helping the unemployed with job training, culinary certification and job placement. The program provides meals cooked in its training classes to those in need and operates a café and catering program.
- *Restoration Immigration Legal Aid* is based in Arlington and provides pro bono legal representation for more than 750 asylum seekers in the community. The program is an affiliate of the Catholic Legal Immigration Network.
- The *Virginia Conservation Network*, headquartered in Richmond, serves as a coordinator for more than 150 conservation programs across Virginia and works to advance a host of environmental protection programs and initiatives.

Responding to the Society of Jesus' call to "walk with the excluded," for nearly 40 years Holy Trinity's Tithe program has set aside 10% of ordinary

LARGE GRANT FOCUS: VIOLENCE PREVENTION IN YOUTH

2023-24 marks the 40th year that Holy Trinity Catholic Church has set aside a percentage of its income to address social justice concerns within the Archdiocese of the District of Columbia and beyond. The Tithe Program seeks to address root causes of social justice issues across the DMV. In 2014, Holy Trinity began allocating a tithe portion to larger social justice grants (>\$20,000) focusing on a priority theme identified each year. These grants have supported social justice work by addressing issues systemically or by making investments to help sustain service and advocacy-oriented work. The 2024 RFP focuses on the following priority theme: violence prevention in youth. We also evaluate small grant requests that address food insecurity, migration/refugees, the environment, homelessness, returning citizens, advocacy and youth. In 2024, we are also interested in projects that address mental health in teens and environmental advocacy. 




