What Do We Bring Back From A Pilgrimage? By Siobhan Dugan

"How was the trip?"

I can't count the number of times friends and family members have asked that question since our group of 36 pilgrims returned from Holy Trinity's pilgrimage to Turkey and Greece. I could answer in any number of ways – it was fun, informative, exhausting, overwhelming ... and profoundly spiritual. It's not that any of those answers are wrong. But they're all inadequate, even the profoundly spiritual part.

I've spent hours peeling back the abundant layers of the experience. Father Ben Hawley, who led the pilgrimage, pointed out at our first pre-trip gathering that a pilgrimage begins with the decision to do it. What he didn't say was when it would end, and I'm finding that hasn't happened yet.

I had no idea what to expect of the pilgrimage, so it was full of surprises – all of them happy. Our gatherings beforehand left me unprepared for one of the greatest aspects of the trip: how thoroughly our group bonded. Father Ben had decided not to limit the number of pilgrims, which opened the door to the logistical nightmare of doing anything with

36 people. But that was never a problem. We bonded so quickly as a group that by the end of the trip, we were all taking care of one another, looking at each event through

one another's eyes, and laughing at the inside jokes that developed over the 10 days. I came away knowing that I have made friends for life of people I barely knew beforehand.

The eyes of other pilgrims made all the difference when we visited Ephesus. Afterward, several people talked about the awesome opportunity to walk where St. Paul had actually walked, wondering if our feet were touching the same ground that his feet had touched so long ago. I welcomed the opportunity to see that through their eyes, since I spent our time in Ephesus trying to stay upright on the slippery marble slabs that apparently served as sidewalks in the ancient world, leaving no time to reflect on any footsteps other than my own.

Earlier that day, we had visited a building that is purported to be on the site of the house where St. John brought the Blessed Mother to live after the resurrection. I was rolling my eyes inwardly at this, as the historical basis for this site is, shall we say, thin. But after touring the house, our group gathered in a shady spot where Father Ben gave a reflection on the Joyful Mysteries. In that moment, the trip ceased being a nice vacation with interesting events and a convivial group of people. It became, truly, a pilgrimage, a journey for my soul.

This became even more clear when we visited an icon workshop in Greece. It was incredible to watch the iconographer, a Greek Orthodox priest, as he worked on writing the latest creation. There were hundreds of icons available in the workshop but I hesitated while the other pilgrims selected those of favorite saints.

I thought there was a slim possibility that there would be an icon of St. Patrick, to honor my Irish roots, but there was no chance whatsoever of finding an icon of my most beloved saint, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, with whom I share my central New York birthplace. Instead, I was drawn to an icon depicting the wedding feast at Cana. It's now in my home and I treasure it, both for its beauty and for the way it has changed my perspective of Christ's first miracle.

The pilgrimage didn't offer much time for reflection in the first days, but the places we visited in Greece required a couple of lengthy bus rides. Father Ben took advantage of the time by offering us questions to discuss with our seat mates, and suggested switching seats with each round of questions. The last question he posed was, what do we bring back – for ourselves, for those we love, and for Holy Trinity, as a result of this pilgrimage? I'm still pondering that question and reflecting on the privilege of being a pilgrim.
