Welcoming the Stranger as a Mentor

Last April, I hiked the Offa's Dyke trail across Wales, a hilly and muddy trek, with my wife, Julie. We were wet, cold, and tired on most days, uncertain whether we would finish the 180-mile trail. In an unexpected way, these difficult days prepared us for gratitude.

One hard day we arrived at St. Mary, an old stone church in Newchurch. Some country churches in Wales leave their doors unlocked for strangers, and in this church was a tea kettle and fresh cake waiting for hikers passing through. We wrung out our gloves and dried them over a heater, made tea, and reflected on the generosity of unseen parishioners who welcomed us, two strangers, when we needed them. For people who rarely ask for help, this hand up meant a great deal to us.

Holy Trinity also gives a hand up to strangers. The Migrant Team is one way. We've welcomed over 23 migrant families and individuals, helping them get started in a place that is their best hope. Perhaps you've heard some of their stories, about the violence and poverty in their home countries, about the good schools they've found here for their children, or about the medical care that has improved their lives.



Holy Trinity is getting ready to welcome more strangers into our migrant familia and we are looking for mentors to give them a hand up. Each person we welcome has a small group of mentors to offer friendship, identify

needs, and help them navigate through an unfamiliar community. For specialized needs, like medical and mental health care, we have team members waiting to assist. Mentors often work with a family or individual for a year or more, depending on the circumstances.

Since August 2022, Julie and I have been mentors for a family from Ukraine – Kateryna, her mother, and her two young sons, Sasha (6) and Hera (3). Standing with us were people on the Migrant Team who connected the family to medical care, spotted work opportunities, organized transportation, gave them English lessons, and much more.

After a little more than a year, this family has launched. We are filled with admiration for their initiative and resilience, and we call them friends. We also found friends and models of faith on the migrant team, something we were looking for.

Perhaps you're grateful for a time when you were a stranger and someone offered a hand up. Perhaps you're looking for new connections in the parish. You could be a mentor. You could put your faith to work in this way.

The Migrant Team is recruiting potential mentors who may be interested in matching with a migrant family or individual. If you'd like to join that pool, or learn more about the opportunity, please send an e-mail to migrantteam@trinity.org. We'll be in touch.
