FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we approach the sacred season of Lent, a time for personal and communal renewal, there are some changes and developments that I would like to bring to your attention.

First, at the end of the month Fr. Bill O'Neill, S.J. will be returning to us for several months from his refugee ministry in Kenya. You may recall that Fr. Bill was with us for several months last year and not only helped out with audio homilies and liturgies, but also provided talks on moral theology.

In addition, Fr. Jack Dennis, S.J. has been missioned by our Jesuit provincial, Father Joseph O'Keefe, to join the parish ministry team as a parochial vicar. Having had extensive experiences in high school and college ministries, Fr. Dennis brings a wealth of competencies. He will assume his responsibilities in early March.

On another note, you may recall that last year we began

a Strategic Planning process. Focus groups were convened to determine some of the salient issues and needs facing the parish. The information gleaned from these groups was used to develop a survey last spring in which some 1,100 Parishioners participated.

The results of this comprehensive survey of Holy Trinity members coalesced into six major themes:

1. The centrality of the worship experience, with strong satisfaction with the Mass and Liturgies today, and a healthy desire by many to support the ministries of worship.
2. A strong focus on social justice, which emerged as the leading area of personal interest by members, and their top three-to-five-year priority for the Parish.
3. The importance of building connections and a stronger sense of community within the Parish, which recurred perhaps more than any other issue – particularly among younger and newer members, and those who do not feel strongly connected to Holy Trinity today.
4. The priorities of engaging youth and embracing diversity, which seem to be reflected in a concern about the aging of the congregation, as well as in a spiritual imperative to reach out and welcome more diverse members of the community.

5. A focus on the role of women within the church, which is one of the highest three-to-five-year priorities for the Parish, and which is advanced almost as much by men at Holy Trinity as by women.
6. A hunger for spiritual growth and education, reflected in expressed interest in spiritual ministries and parishioners' own spiritual development.

Among the highlights of the Strategic Plan is a reiteration of the Mission Statement from which a Vision Statement has been developed.

We are a Jesuit parish that welcomes all to ACT:

- **Accompany One Another in Christ** - We make God's accompaniment of the world in Christ present through our accompaniment of each other. Walking together in the way of discipleship is a way of connecting faith and life experience, love of God and love of neighbor. Pope Francis calls us to an "art of accompaniment which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other."

- **Celebrate God's Love** - The liturgy and the sacraments are essential to the life of Holy Trinity. Love of God opens us to hope and to the final horizon of our pilgrimage and nourishes us to better love our neighbors. In this way our labors and failures find meaning, recognizing that everything we have is from God to be given back in accordance with God's will.

- **Transform Lives** - Our many and diverse parish programs and ministries serve to touch and transform the lives of our parishioners and those whom we are called to serve. Guided by the Holy Spirit, in our love of God and love of neighbor, we work together to better be "a living witness to truth and freedom, to peace and justice, that all people may be raised up to a new hope."

Based upon the Mission Statement and the strategic planning process, the Strategic Planning Team developed the following Vision Statement:

Inspired by our Catholic tradition and Ignatian spirituality, and empowered by our laity, Holy Trinity will be an innovative, forward-thinking, globally aware parish for all who wish to worship, learn and serve.

To present these and other dimensions of the Strategic Plan, we will have Town Hall meetings on **March 10 at 10:15 AM in Trinity Hall and 4:00 PM via Zoom**. Stephen Aubin, a member of the Strategic Planning Committee, will present. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

LARGE GRANT FOCUS: VIOLENCE PREVENTION IN YOUTH

2023-24 marks the 40th year that Holy Trinity Catholic Church has set aside a percentage of its income to address social justice concerns within the Archdiocese of the District of Columbia and beyond. The Tithe Program seeks to address root causes of social justice issues across the DMV. In 2014, Holy Trinity Catholic Church began allocating a tithe portion to larger social justice grants (>\$20,000) focusing on a priority theme identified each year. These grants have supported social justice work by addressing issues systemically or by making investments to help sustain service and advocacy-oriented work. The 2024 RFP focuses on the following priority theme: violence prevention in youth. We also evaluate small grant requests that address food insecurity, migration/refugees, the environment, homelessness, returning citizens, advocacy and youth. In 2024, we are also interested in projects that address mental health in teens and environmental advocacy. 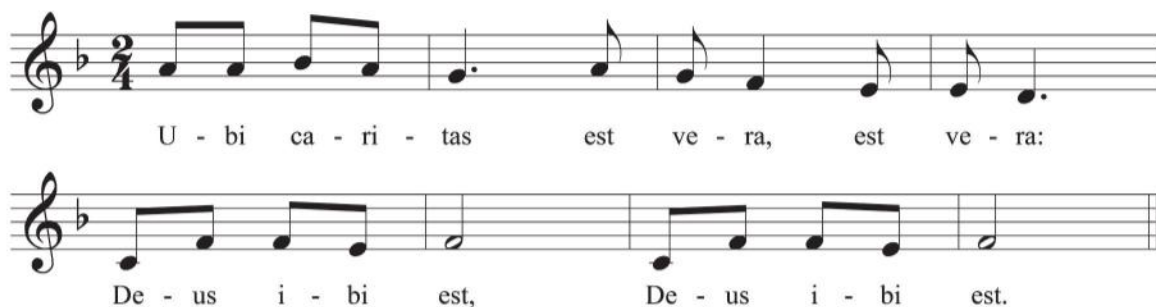

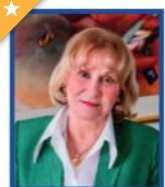

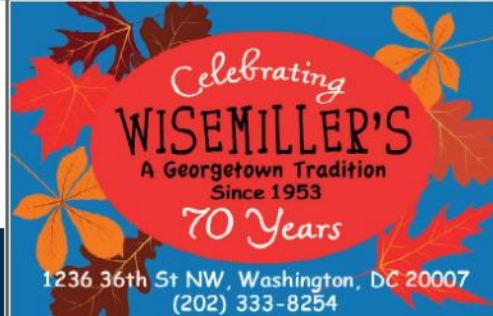
