Easter Sunday, The Resurrection of the Lord



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

“Someday, after mastering the winds, the waves, the tides and gravity, we shall harness for God the energies of love, and then, for a second time in the history of the world, man will have discovered fire.”

These visionary words of the Jesuit priest and scientist, Pierre Teilhard De Chardin offer a cosmic vision of Easter and of the eternal love that radiates from this Divine-Human encounter. With Teilhard we might believe the Easter event to be a radical radiation of God’s love for all creation. As we consider the significance of Easter in the year 2024, suppose we briefly review how our 40-day Lenten journey and Holy Week Triduum brought us to this sacred Day.

How ironic that this year our Lenten journey began on February 14th, Valentine’s Day. Did you, like me, feel a conflict between both fasting and celebrating? Then,



throughout the 40 Days of Lent, day by day and Sunday by Sunday, we read and reflected upon the Scripture readings that invited us into the mysteries surrounding the Paschal Mystery, i.e. the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Holy Week, beginning with Palm Sunday, offered us many opportunities to intensify our encounter with Jesus’ Passion and Death. On Wednesday evening we had a Parish Communal Reconciliation Service whereby dozens of parishioners encountered the healing of Christ through individual Confessions. Next, Holy Thursday

began with a morning Liturgy Service and then the Sacred Triduum began in the evening with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This sacred service invited each participant to be engaged with the Institution of The Eucharist which was preceded by an enactment of Jesus' generous gesture surrounding the Washing of the Feet.

Good Friday continued the invitation to encounter Christ by means of four services: a 9:00am Morning Prayer, a Noon ecumenical prayer service, Seven Last Words, a 4:00pm Stations of the Cross, and an 8:00pm Commemoration of the Lord's Passion.

On Holy Saturday, there was a service involving a Morning Prayer and Preparation Rites, followed by a Noon prayer service next to our Columbarium at Holy Rood Cemetery. Finally, at 8:00 PM the Sacred Triduum culminated in The Great Easter Vigil.

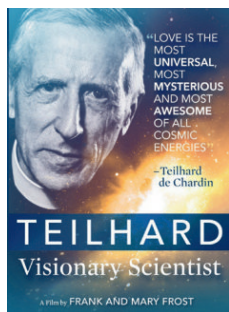

KINO BORDER INITIATIVE

If you are interested in learning more about the border - then consider joining members on an immersion trip to the Kino Border Initiative in Nogales, Arizona April 5-9. The Kino Border Initiative (KBI) is a binational organization that works in the area of migration and is located in Nogales, Arizona and Nogales, Sonora, Mexico. It is named after Fr. Eusebio Kino, an early Jesuit missionary in the Sonoran Desert.

The KBI's vision is to help make humane, just, workable migration between the U.S. and Mexico a reality. Its mission is to promote US/Mexico border and immigration policies that affirm the dignity of the human person and a spirit of bi-national solidarity.

The goals of this trip are to humanize, accompany, and complicate. We often talk in the abstract about immigration and the border, but the word humanize means to listen to firsthand stories and experiences and recognize the dignity of each individual, whether they be migrants or border residents. Accompany means that we will be on a journey over the course of the days on immersion. You will have the opportunity to bear witness at the moment of deportation through conversations with deported migrants as well as along many different points in the journey, such as the desert and the federal courthouse. The focus of the immersion is not service, but rather presence. Complicate means that the simple answers are oftentimes the wrong ones. Instead, we invite participants to explore questions, nuance and the many different puzzle pieces of migration and the border without having to come to a definitive conclusion.

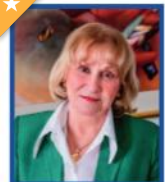
