As Parish Council Election Season Approaches, Members Share Reflections On Why They Serve

Each year, as Spring unfolds, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) begins to recruit potential new members to run for a seat on the Council at the end of May. As the election season approaches, now is the time for the discernment as to whether you are being called to serve on the parish council. We will share more information in the following weeks about how and when to self-nominate. (Any parishioner who has been registered for more than 1 year and is over 18 is eligible.) For now, some current PPC members want to share some of their own “Whys.” We hope these reflections will help you to consider your own calling:

Jennifer Dorsey: I serve because I am able to use the gifts that God granted me to give back to the parish that has been my soft landing, my safe place, and my spiritual home. I continue to be humbled by the incredible talent and passion that each member and parish leader brings to their work and the time they give. I serve to be there for them, as they are for me, so that we can all succeed in serving our parish.

John Brain: My hope, in serving on the PPC, is that in some small way I will ensure the continuity of the parish’s



presence and mission in a world that seems to need it more and more every day. I want Holy Trinity to be there when my two young children need it. I want Holy Trinity to be there to give warmth and comfort to the next stranger who walks through our doors for the first time.

Judith Bunnell: I find inspiration and regularly deepen my faith through my interactions with other PPC

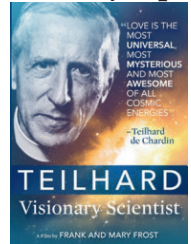

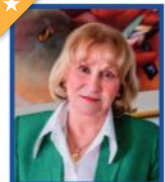
