

Pilgrims like us embark on pilgrimage to find, if not "the holy blissful martyr," then certainly God who invites us into deeper experience of God. And not just God but also of ourselves as people of faith and of God who acted in the history of our ancestors, their experience of God, of themselves and the culture around them.

Beginning around 1060AD the Norman French, who conquered England in 1066, conquered present-day Italy and Sicily, bringing with them their language, culture, and religion. In Sicily they found an already-thriving culture of Latins, Arab Muslims and Byzantine Greeks. Rather than repress them, the Normans settled among them, offering them religious liberty, and drawing

on their artistry to build what we now call the Arab-Norman church. We will visit some of these cathedrals as well as other churches and religious sites. And not just visit but also pray and reflect on this history as part of our story of faith. To ground this history we will visit some of the best-preserved Greek temples from the 6th Century BC as well as Roman ruins that St Paul may have visited.

Jesuits came to Sicily as missionaries just after the Society's founding in 1540, building the Gesu Church in Palermo in 1571, which we will visit. The growing middle class found in the Jesuits the ability to organize schools and teach. Beginning with a school in Messina in 1548, education became the major work of the Society. We will visit present-day Jesuit sites to recall this long history.

We will make this retreat in the Ignatian manner, knowing ourselves as pilgrims, seeking God in our experience, balancing reflection on experience with celebrating the Eucharist together in several churches we visit.

Our Daily Itinerary

DAY 1, SUNDAY, NOV 3: DEPART THE USA

• This morning, we gather at Washington Dulles Airport for our flight to Rome, with complimentary meals and beverages served on board

DAY 2, MONDAY, NOV 4: ARRIVE PALERMO: TRANSFER TO HOTEL

- We arrive in Rome and transfer to our flight to Palermo
- Upon arrival in Palermo, we meet our Catholic Travel Centre tour manager who will accompany us throughout our journey

- We board our private motor coach and begin a panoramic tour of the city until check-in time at our hotel
- At one time the favored haunt of writers, poets and artists, Palermo's esoteric beauty seduces its visitors. The city manages to hang on to its essential fascination drawing its personality from the peoples who have populated its streets over the ages – Byzantine, Arab, Norman and others – all who have left their indelible mark not only in the form of a rich artistic heritage but in the very vital rhythm of life in the city
- We gather for dinner at the hotel restaurant (D)

DAY 3, TUESDAY, NOV 5: PALERMO: VISIT GESU CHURCH & CITY TOUR

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- The Jesuits arrived in Palermo in 1549, and by the late 16th century began building a church adjacent to their professed house (*casa professa*) based on a design by the Jesuit architect Giovanni Tristano
- We visit and celebrate Mass at the Church of the Gesù known also as the Saint Mary of Jesus (Santa Maria di Gesù) or the Casa Professa, a Baroque-style, Jesuit Church
- We visit and have an encounter with the leadership at the nearby *Centro Astalli*, a center for immigrants under the auspices of Jesuit Refugee Services
- We have time for lunch on our own
- Afternoon visit of the Cathedral of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary, erected in 1185. We will see the monumental tombs of King Roger II and various family members. They are the very first examples of medieval free-standing secular tombs in the West
- Our guide will complete our day with a walking tour of the city. For those interested in visiting the Palatine Chapel in the Norman Palace, you are welcome to do so on your own
- Dinner tonight is served at the hotel restaurant (B, D)

DAY 4, WEDNESDAY, NOV 6: PALERMO: EXCURSION TO MONREALE & LEISURE TIME

- Breakfast served at our hotel
- Depart by motor coach to Monreale
- We visit the Cathedral (Santa Maria la Nuovo) begun in 1174. This cathedral was built at the order of William II. The interior walls of the Cathedral are completely decorated with mosaics of glittering gold that portray scenes from the Old and New Testament
- We gather for lunch at a local restaurant in Monreale
- We return to Palermo for some time to explore the city on our own
- Dinner is on our own this evening in Palermo to explore the local restaurants (B, L)

DAY 5, THURSDAY, NOV 7: PALERMO / AGRIGENTO: VALLEY OF THE TEMPLES

- Breakfast served at our hotel.
- Check out of hotel and board motor coach for Agrigento, home of a democracy 2500 years ago
- We will stop for lunch on our own at a local restaurant
- Our focus this afternoon is the archaeological site of the Valley of the Temples, where we will enjoy a guided visit of this UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is one of the most outstanding examples of ancient

Greek art and architecture and is one of the main attractions of Sicily

• Check-in at hotel, and dinner follows at the hotel restaurant (B, D)

DAY 6, FRIDAY, NOV 8: AGRIGENTO: VISIT OF THE CATHEDRAL, CHURCH OF SANTA MARIA DEI GRECI, BENEDICTINE MONASTERY & MUSEUM

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- We will visit the Cathedral dedicated to St. Gerland, built in the original Arab-Norman style. Consecrated in 1099, the cathedral was part of an "ecclesia munita" (fortified church), a place of worship and defense. Originally dedicated to the Virgin Mary of the Assumption, it was later consecrated to St. Gerland. Here we celebrate Mass.
- Walking through the Via di Santa Maria dei Greci we access the small church of the same name in the oldest district of the medieval city. Built in the 12th century, it rests its foundations on the base of a Doric temple from the 5th century BC. The Church with its small and elegant courtyard, has a façade with a thirteenth-century Arab-Norman portal and beautiful single-lancet windows
- Free time for lunch on your own to explore the restaurants and shops along Via Atenea, the town's main pedestrian thoroughfare
- Afternoon visit to the former Monastery of the Holy Spirit. It was the home of the Benedictine nuns until the mid-19th century. It is now a civic museum
- We return to our hotel for dinner and the evening (B, D)

DAY 7, SATURDAY, NOV 9: AGRIGENTO / PIAZZA ARMERINA: PRIORY OF ANDREA & VILLA ROMANA DEL CASALE / CATANIA

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- Check out of hotel and board our motor coach
- Arrive in Piazza Armerina
- We visit the Church of St. Andrea, which belongs to the Grand Priory of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. It is the oldest church in Piazza Armerina and one of the most interesting works for the Sicilian Middle Ages. Here we celebrate Mass
- We will have some time in Piazza Armerina for lunch on our own
- We visit the Villa Romana del Casale from the 4th century AD, an elaborate Roman villa housing among the largest and richest collection of Roman mosaics anywhere, earning it the distinction of a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Continue on to Catania for check-in at our hotel
- Dinner is served at our hotel restaurant (B, D)

DAY 8, SUNDAY, NOV 10: CATANIA: VISIT OF THE BENEDICTINE MONASTERY, CATHEDRAL, AND JESUIT CHURCH

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- We visit the Benedictine Monastery and Church St. Nicolo l'Arena (desacralized), a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- We continue with a walking tour of the city
- Lunch is on our own
- This afternoon we visit the Cathedral Basilica of St. Agatha, followed by a visit to the nearby Abbey of St. Agatha, patron saint and protector of the city. Devotion to the Saint protected the people of Catania from the Plague, the invasion of the Moors and the eruptions of Etna
- We visit the Jesuit Church of the Holy Crucifix of Miracles, built in 1785. Here we celebrate Mass
- Dinner this evening is served at a local restaurant (B, D)

DAY 9, MONDAY, NOV 11: CATANIA: EXCURSION TO SIRACUSA: NEAPOLIS, CATACOMBS OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST & CATHEDRAL OF BIRTH OF THE VIRGIN MARY

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- Today we make an excursion to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Siracusa, known for its Greek and Roman history. It is the birthplace of Archimedes
- We visit the Neapolis Archeological Park, containing the stunning Greek Theatre as well as the Roman Amphitheatre that combine to make this one of the greatest archaeological sites in all of Italy
- We visit the nearby Catacombs of St. John the Baptist which contain some 20,000 early Christian tombs and the ruins of the Church of St. John the Baptist where tradition tells us St. Paul preached (Acts 28:11-13). The building has an inscription in memory of the brief stay of St. Paul in Siracusa: "HIC OLIM SYRACUSIS TRIDUO MANENTIS." (*He stayed in Siracusa for three days*)
- · We enjoy some free time for lunch on our own
- We will visit the Cathedral of the Birth of the Virgin Mary in Ortigia. The ancient site dates back to the 5th century BC. The present Cathedral was constructed in the 7th century. As of 2015, the cathedral holds a number of relics of St. Lucy, the patroness of the city
- We return to Catania
- Dinner this evening is served at a local restaurant (B, D)

DAY 10, TUESDAY, NOV 12: CATANIA / MESSINA / CEFALU

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- Check out from our hotel and travel to Messina
- Visit the Metropolitan Cathedral of Our Lady of the Assumption. Built by the Normans, it was consecrated in 1197 by the Archbishop Berardo.

The current building is the final result of some twentieth-century reconstructions, which took place following the disastrous earthquake of 1908, and the considerable damage that resulted from the heavy aerial bombardment in World War II. Only an original mosaic and statue have survived. The tower houses the Messina astronomical clock, the largest astronomical clock in the world

- Visit site of the original Jesuit College, the first Jesuit educational institution founded in 1548 and see the preserved portico from the 16th century
- · Lunch follows at a nearby restaurant
- Continue to Cefalu for check-in at our hotel
- Dinner served at the hotel restaurant (B,L,D)

DAY 11, WEDNESDAY, NOV 13: CEFALU: VISIT OF THE TOWN

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- We will visit the Holy Spirit Cathedral. It was erected between 1131 and 1240 in the Norman architectural style. According to tradition, the building was erected after a vow made to the Holy Savior by the King of Sicily, Roger II, after he escaped from a storm to land on the city's beach. The building has a fortress-like character and, seen from a distance, it dominates the skyline of the surrounding medieval town. It made a powerful statement of the Norman presence. Here we celebrate the closing Mass of our pilgrimage
- Time to stroll the friendly streets and Piazza Duomo
- Afternoon at our leisure
- Dinner is served at our hotel restaurant (B, D)

DAY 12, THURSDAY, NOV 14: CEFALU / PALERMO: BALLARO MARKET & PEDRO ARRUPE INSTITUTE

- Breakfast served at our hotel and orientation to the day
- Check out of hotel and continue to Palermo to experience the Ballaro Market, the city's largest outdoor market
- We visit the Pedro Arrupe Institute for Political Formation, a Jesuit educational institute (subject to confirmation)
- We enjoy a farewell lunch at a local restaurant with final reflection and prayer
- The afternoon and dinner are at our leisure, to prepare for our early departure tomorrow (B, L)

DAY 13, FRIDAY, NOV 15: RETURN TO THE USA

• This morning we check out and transfer to the airport for our return flight to the USA

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary, either due to changes in airline schedules or for other reasons. All Masses and local visits are subject to local schedules and to substitution if not available.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS & CONDITIONS: Any payments made by a Traveler or on behalf of the Traveler ("Traveler", "you") to Catholic Travel Centre (CTC) toward any CTC tour shall constitute acceptance of all Terms & Conditions provided herein.

PAYMENT TERMS: All payments shall be made on the dates indicated in the payment schedule, noted in the Registration Information section. Late payments are subject to a non-refundable \$150 fee, and may result in cancellation. A Traveler registering within 120 days prior to departure must provide full payment by cashier check, plus a non-refundable late registration \$150 fee. CTC reserves the right to cancel registrations not paid in full 105 days prior to tour departure and to charge fees per the Cancellation Policy. A non-refundable \$75 fee is charged on all returned payments. Travelers agree not to dispute any credit card charges associated with this trip before contacting CTC first to resolve their concerns. CTC retains the right to dispute any chargeback that is improper and recover any costs, including attorney's fees related to improper chargebacks. Additionally, in the event of an improper chargeback, NOTE: Credit card charges will not show as "travel expense" on your credit card statement, but will appear as "specialty services", "shopping" or another designation.

CHANGES IN PACKAGE: After initial invoicing, changes from the air inclusive package ("Full Package") to "Land Only" or vice versa are subject to a non-refundable \$75 per person per change fee. Changes must be requested in writing to CTC at least 130 days prior to departure date (subject to availability). Late requests to change the package may not be accommodated.

CHANGES IN FORM OF PAYMENT: To change from Cash Discount to Standard pricing, the difference between prices plus an additional \$75 fee applies. After a Traveler's credit card has been charged for any portion of the tour, s/he is ineligible for the Cash Discount Price.

PARTIAL PACKAGES NOT AVAILABLE: Tour Packages are offered as described in this brochure, at the stated price. Partial package purchase is not available.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION POLICY: CTC's cancellation policy is in effect upon first payment toward any CTC tour. A Traveler's cancellation must be provided in writing either by email, fax, or registered mail to CTC. The cancellation by the Traveler is effective on the date of the cancellation email, fax, or date of postmark. The Traveler forfeits the following fees to CTC based on the date of cancellation notice: anytime up to 120 days prior to departure, \$500 fee; 119 to 90 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 25% of Land Cost (all costs except airfare and related taxes, fees, surcharges); 89 to 60 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 50% of Land Cost plus the full cost of all of the Traveler's airline travel (including airfare and related taxes, fees, surcharges); 59 days or fewer, all payments by Traveler made to CTC are forfeited, and there are no refunds. In event of individual cancellation, no name changes or substitutions are permitted. No shows: Passengers who do not show up for the group's departing flight (or land only passengers who do not show for first hotel night) will be considered as tour cancellations: their airline and/or hotel reservations will automatically be cancelled and cannot be reinstated

PRICES: If the group does not reach the size advertised, the price or programming will be adjusted accordingly. Pricing is based on exchange rates and fares applicable at the time of quotation and is subject to change. Fuel surcharges are subject to increase up to 30 days prior to departure.

The Traveler agrees not to hold CTC, our suppliers, or the group leaders responsible should they contract any illness during or after their travel. CTC cannot change its Cancellation Policy or Terms & Conditions based on any such warning or advisory or the occurrence of any terror, health, pandemic, or other incident in one or more of the places this tour is scheduled to visit. All cancellation penalties remain in full force and effect. It is your responsibility to be aware of any and all requirements for admittance to a country or state, including COVID-19 requirements. Certain countries have a requirement for foreign visitors to have valid medical insurance on entry. CTC cannot be held responsible for denied entry if the Traveler is unable to provide details to authorities of insurance or denial of entry for any reason.

ITINERARY: The itinerary presented in this brochure represents what CTC is planning for this trip; however, the itinerary is subject to final confirmations and changes in local schedules. While no changes are anticipated, CTC, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to change the itinerary, as it deems necessary or advisable. CTC is not responsible for costs or fees related to itinerary changes necessitated by changes in an airline's schedule or other arrangements not made through CTC.

FINAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Travelers receive travel documents by email approximately two weeks prior to departure. Bulk items such as luggage and names tags will be shipped by CTC to group leaders for distribution.

ACCOMMODATIONS AND MEALS: Accommodations are based on double/ twin rooms with private bathroom facilities. A limited number of single rooms are available and are subject to a single room supplement fee. If no roommate is available for you, or your roommate cancels prior to departure, a single room supplement surcharge applies. Triple rooms are not always available and are discouraged because of cramped quarters; no price reduction for triple rooms. Meals are either menu of the day or buffet. LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: Travelers arranging their own airline ticket must meet the group at the first hotel of the itinerary.
