The Ascension of the Lord

Coming Into Full Communion With The Church: One Neophyte Reflects On His Journey

At the Easter Vigil on March 30, 2024, twelve people – seven adults and five youth – were reborn in the waters of baptism, sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit through confirmation, and joined in the fullness of the Catholic faith tradition by receiving the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist. These adults and youth journeyed together for a year or more as part



of the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). The youth met separately for Tuesday evening catechesis and Sunday morning dismissal. However, they celebrated the rites with the adults and at times joined in their Tuesday evening discussions.

During the Easter season, these newly initiated, or neophytes, have continued to meet, reflecting on their experience in order to enter more deeply into the mysteries of Christ, and consider how to respond to Christ's invitation to discipleship through active involvement in the parish community of Holy Trinity.

One of these newly initiated is Dylan Sanchez, an 8th grader at the Woods Academy in Washington, DC who will be attending St. Albans in the fall. Dylan shares his experience and reflection below:

Q: What do you remember most about your preparation for the sacraments?

Tuesday night classes were really fun, informative, and inspiring. Going into it I didn't know much, but we read together and played games like Jeopardy that helped me learn so much. I also liked sitting in on some of the adult classes - because they really made space to involve us and listen to what we kids had to share. The dismissals on Sunday were also really nice, because the entire church was surrounding us and making us feel accepted. The blessings from the priest were especially nice on Sunday dismissal days because it felt like he was taking the steps with us.

Q: Where in the preparation did you have a sense of God's presence guiding you?

Mr. Bednar's Religion class is my favorite subject. But it wasn't until this process that I was finally able to confidently raise my hand to answer a question about scripture, or the sacraments, or the Spiritual Works of Mercy. This process helped me better take in the knowledge Mr. Bednar shared in the classroom and better understand what devotion to God means. I know that none if this could be possible without God's presence and guidance.

Q: What was it like to be baptized? To be confirmed? To celebrate Communion for the first time?

That evening, I felt overwhelming joy. I felt a sense of accomplishment because of all the time we spent to go through the process. I felt the presence of God when my family surprised me and came all the way from NYC to see my baptism and confirmation. That night I also felt closer than ever to all the people from RCIA as we all experienced the water, candles and processions together. I also appreciated that Father Gillespie made the evening feel very special and so much fun.

Q: Is there anything else you'd like to share?

I recommend anyone thinking about the process to do it at Holy Trinity. We had several options to consider when I was called to follow my faith, and I feel so lucky that my mom and I decided that I should do it here. I'm excited about getting more involved in the parish activities, especially altar service, youth activities and social justice missions.

Everyone at Holy Trinity has been very welcoming, but I would like to especially thank Ms. Anne Koester for all of her kindness, encouragement and for believing in me, Ms. Anne Marie Kaufmann for her excellent teaching, patience and guidance, Ms. Amanda Harrison for the thoughtful Sunday discussions and reflections, Mr. Nicolas Sanchez for sponsoring my journey into the Catholic faith, Mr. Richard Lee for his support and encouragement, and all of the people who participate in RCIA who have cheered me (and my mom) on each week. Most important I would like to shout out my fellow youth RCIA crew - Ethan, Jonna, Beckham and Tate for sharing in this lifelong journey together. I'm really glad God brought us all together.
