Getting To Know 6 New Tithe Recipients

From The Social Justice Ministry

Holy Trinity's Tithe Grant program (ten percent of parishioners' regular collections) seeks to address root causes of social justice issues both locally and within the global community. This concrete and ongoing commitment to social justice is a priority among Holy Trinity parishioners, and its careful and transparent distribution is an important responsibility of the Social Justice Committee.

The amount available this year from the pledge and general/holiday offerings is \$443,000. Fr. Gillespie and the committee agreed to supplement the total with \$70,000 from the Alms/Community Fund, bringing the total funds available to \$513,000.

The large grant focus for 2024 is on violence prevention in youth. The committee opted to award grants totaling \$100,000 to two organizations: BEST Kids, Inc. (\$65,000) and the T.R.I.G.G.E.R. Project (\$35,000).

In addition to the large grant theme, each year the committee awards small grants (\$5,000-\$20,000) to organizations addressing environmental justice, racial justice, refugees/migration, returning citizens, homelessness, and youth. The committee is guided by the Apostolic Preferences: Showing the Way to God; Walking with the Excluded; Journeying with Youth; and Care for Our Common Home. We also award grants to our sister parishes.



We are excited to have awarded grants to 30 organizations - including **six new groups**, which are detailed below:

BEST Kids, Inc.

BEST Kids was established in 2001 to provide mentoring services to youth in foster care and youth at-risk ages 6-21 in the Washington, DC area. BEST Kids empowers this vulnerable population through one-on-one and group mentoring, college and career readiness and life skills programs.

The award will support the implementation of a comprehensive youth violence prevention program that will employ the expertise of a Youth Violence Prevention Coordinator, integrate an evidence-based violence prevention curriculum and training into existing mentoring and peer support programs, and provide critical support to at-risk youth ages 10-17.

BUILD Metro DC

BUILD is a youth entrepreneurship nonprofit that prioritizes youth of color, particularly Black and Latinx youth, from under-resourced communities. The award will support their 2023/2024 youth entrepreneurship program which will serve more than 320 DC students.

Emma's Torch

The mission of Emma's Torch is to train refugees, asylees, and survivors of human trafficking in the culinary arts and to empower them to build meaningful careers in the culinary industry. The grant will support their work in preparation of quadrupling the number of DC students served in the next five years.

Interfaith Power & Light

For two decades, Interfaith Power & Light has undertaken grassroots climate and energy education in DC, Maryland and Northern Virginia faith communities. The award will prioritize the mobilizing of Catholic communities for climate action.

T.R.I.G.G.E.R Project

T.R.I.G.G.E.R (True Reason I Grabbed the Gun Evolves from Risks) was founded in 2019 with a mission to de-normalize and destigmatize gun violence in our communities of color in Washington, DC.

Their goal is to reach the youth and youth ecosystems to provide research and evidence based practices that

will build a future almost void of interpersonal gun violence. The award will support the development of the TRIGGER University program.

Thank you to Tithe Committee members for their commitment and diligence, especially outgoing members Alejandra Obando and Jacqui Mooney.

PREVENTING GUN VIOLENCE

Beginning September 2024

Just Faith launched a new program on gun violence that the social justice ministry would like to offer in the fall if there is enough interest. Grounded in Christian faith, this program aspires to move beyond the divisive rhetoric of gun ownership versus gun control, instead inviting participants to discern solutions to the gun violence epidemic.

This program consists of eight virtual sessions, plus an immersion experience. All regular sessions include prayer, dialogue, active listening, weekly spiritual practices, and relationship-building. There is a small registration fee and you will need to purchase the book required for discussion. Space is limited to 10 participants. 

Creation Care Corner

Climate and Protecting the Unborn

Yet another downside to a warming climate is the impact on pregnant women. A growing concern is that as temperatures warm, it enables malaria-carrying mosquitoes to expand their range. Pregnant women are three times more likely to develop severe malaria compared to nonpregnant women. The disease can produce severe maternal anemia, and can spread to the kidneys and the lungs, harming the mother. The disease also attacks the placenta, making it up to four times more likely a mother would miscarry. Babies born to mothers sick with malaria come out of the womb malnourished and underweight. About half of all pregnancies worldwide occur in areas where people are at risk of contracting malaria. A 2023 study estimated that 16 million of these pregnancies ended in miscarriage, and 1.4 million in stillbirth. Promoting a consistent ethic of life suggests supporting preventative care for pregnant women likely to be exposed to malaria, and taking action to reduce fossil fuel consumption that is a driver of global warming.
