## Holy Trinity, Climate Change and *Laudato Si'*

Pope Francis published the encyclical *Laudato Si'* in 2015. It focuses on care for the natural environment and all people, as well as broader questions of the relationship between God, humans, and the Earth. *Laudato Si'* means "praise be to you" in Italian, quoting St. Francis of Assisi's "*Canticle of the Creatures*" in which the saint praises God by meditating on the goodness of sun, wind, Earth, water, and other natural forces.

At Holy Trinity, our parishioners have embraced the call of the Holy Father to reduce the use of carbon-based energy sources, including electricity and natural gas. We also are working to become a "zero-waste" campus through the use of recycling and composting, with the energetic leadership of our incredible Green Team, led by parishioners Annie and John Hisle. The Green Team focuses on what our parishioners can do in their homes and in their communities. The group also looks at what steps the parish can take in the pursuit of environmental sustainability. For our parish, they have accomplished a lot.

**Solar Panels** - Holy Trinity parishioners, including HTS' class of 2021, 2022, and 2023, raised funds to put solar panels on the flat roofs of our upper and lower school buildings. Now, after years of reviews, delays, and design changes, the project is finally underway! The Archdiocese's



College of Consultors gave final approval on May 16 and the contractor has started work. You will see solar panels going up in July and August (during the school break) with a special blessing at the parish's Green Ministry fair on September 29, 2024. Once brought online, this system could produce an estimated 10,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) of alternating current (AC) power per month, assuming at

least 5 sun hours per day. While it will never provide all our electrical needs, it will make a big difference.

**Composting & Net Zero Efforts** - Composting reduces greenhouse gas emissions, improves soil health, and conserves water. Through our many receptions and events, we have generated a lot of food waste and paper that could be composted. Now, partnering with a commercial composter, Compost Crew, Holy Trinity is expanding our use of composting to all of our parish events and activities. All single-use products used at parish events, including knives and forks, cups and plates, are compostable, not to mention any uneaten food, donut and pizza boxes, etc. Those materials must now be placed in designated composting bins and will be collected weekly. Additionally, our facilities team installed an energy-efficient dishwasher in the kitchen, which will allow events to use washable cups, plates, cutlery, etc. that do not have to be composted but can be reused.

**Recycling** - Even before composting, Holy Trinity has been committed to recycling, including aluminum cans, office paper and other materials. (Recycling involves breaking down materials to create new products, while composting involves breaking down organic waste to create soil.) We recently began recycling copier/printer cartridges throughout the parish. And single-use plastic water bottles are a thing of the past - replaced by filtered water fountains.

**Lighting and HVAC** - The bulk of our energy use at Holy Trinity comes from lighting and air handling, with almost 1 million kilowatts used each year. Since conducting a comprehensive energy audit in 2022, the parish has made some big progress. New air-conditioning units on the roof of the Faber building were installed last year, reducing electricity use by a whopping 45%! This coming year will see an even greater savings when we replace the aging and inefficient units on the roof of the lower school. Making these changes doesn't only reduce our impact on the environment, it affects our bottom line. This summer will also see a transformation in lighting at Holy Trinity. The Archdiocese recently approved a \$230,000 project to convert virtually all of our lighting to LED in the upper and lower schools and

the Parish Center. Compared to fluorescent bulbs, LED lights are up to **80% more efficient**. In addition, LED lighting is dimmable, steady and more comfortable. Of note – since 2018, Holy Trinity has been purchasing all of its electricity from renewable sources (solar, wind, etc.) under an Archdiocese-negotiated contract.

**Other Environmental Initiatives** - The dark roofs on the Parish Center and Faber towers were replaced in 2023 with reflective material that reflects the sun's heat away from the building, saving air-conditioning costs. Coming out of COVID, many parish employees were permitted a hybrid work schedule, reducing the number of commutes. We also provide Metro subsidies to encourage the use of public transportation. Partnering with goDCgo, we have submitted a TDM Proposal (Transportation Demand Management) to project reductions in vehicle traffic and promote alternate transportation sources. Lastly, Holy Trinity has replaced the pastor's sedan with a 2024 Toyota Prius, a hybrid vehicle that gets 57 miles per gallon in city driving.

**The Green Team Keeps You Informed** - Holy Trinity's Green Team holds monthly Zoom meetings at which they present and discuss a variety of climate-related measures we all can take. There are regular posts in the parish e-Letter and Social Justice e-Letter with ideas about how we can address our lifestyles which may be contributing to climate change. The Green Team is also a big proponent of citizen advocacy – encouraging everyone's help writing in support of climate-related state, local, and federal legislation. ## TRAIN A JESUIT IN RWANDA AND BURUNDI

The Rwanda-Burundi Region of the Society of Jesus was created in 1999. It previously had been part of the Central African Province along with the Democratic Republic of Congo. It is the watershed tragedy of the Genocide in 1994 and regional security problems that caused the split. Today, the Region counts around 100 Jesuits, and more than 70% of them are still in formation. The average cost to train a Jesuit in Africa, per year, is \$9,000, and it takes about twelve years to form one Jesuit. During and after their training, Jesuits in Rwanda and Burundi actively work in education, services to help the poor, retreat centers, healing and reconciliation ministries, HIV/AIDS ministry, Refugees Service, youth Ministries, vocation promotion, parish work, ecological and social justice programs.

### PREVENTING GUN VIOLENCE

#### Beginning September 2024

Just Faith launched a new program on gun violence that the social justice ministry would like to offer in the fall if there is enough interest. Grounded in Christian faith, this program aspires to move beyond the divisive rhetoric of gun ownership versus gun control, instead inviting participants to discern solutions to the gun violence epidemic.

This program consists of eight virtual sessions, plus an immersion experience. All regular sessions include prayer, dialogue, active listening, weekly spiritual practices, and relationship-building. There is a small registration fee and you will need to purchase the book required for discussion. Space is limited to 10 participants. 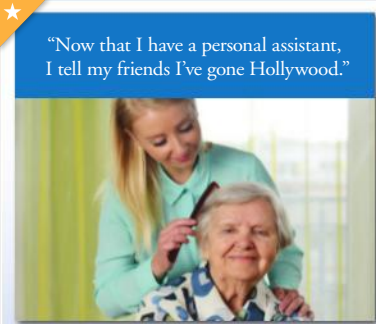

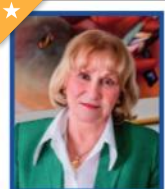
