That we continue the pilgrimage in both familiar and new ways, let us go forth in peace;

That we come to know Jesus better, love him more, and serve Him more faithfully, **let us abide in God's love**;

With whatever fears, sorrows, joys and anticipations may be ours, let us trust in Emmanuel, God with us;

With the Lord watching over us as our paths diverge,

let us follow in the footsteps of the One Lord, the Risen Christ.

We pray all these things in his name: and always for the greater Glory of God.

FAREWELL TO KATIE LASKEY: AFTER THE 9:30 AND 11:30 AM MASSES ON JULY 28

Katie Laskey has served as the Coordinator of Youth Ministry at Holy Trinity for the past two years. During this time, she developed a core team of volunteers to lead the Sunday Morning Youth Group and led a summer week of service to Baltimore for high school teens and a week of local service for junior high youth. She has helped engage young people more fully in parish life through the Parish Council and liturgy. She also integrated Ignatian Spirituality and social justice into youth events such as the Ignatian Family Teach In and weekly faith sharing during Lent. Beyond youth mininstry, Katie served at Holy Trinity as a sacristan and extraordinary minister of Communion and was a part of our lay preaching team. Because of her passion for a fuller participation of young people in the life of the Church, Holy Trinity has come closer to realizing the Apostolic Preference of "accompanying young people in the creation of a hope-filled future." In the past two years, we have more fully "walked by their side; glimpsed the future with them; and walked with them in order to perceive and discern where the Spirit is leading our world and our Church." One of the chaperones on the Baltimore trip shared this about Katie: "It was Katie's gentle, open and illuminating leadership in our group reflections that helped us truly gel as an inclusive and fun community. Her peaceful being and openness inspired my trust and the trust of our young people." As Katie moves to Seattle, we pray that God may bless her abudantly with the grace to continue "accompany young people in the creation of a hope-filled future."

TRAIN A JESUIT IN RWANDA AND BURUNDI

The Rwanda-Burundi Region of the Society of Jesus was created in 1999. It previously had been part of the Central African Province along with the Democratic Republic of Congo. It is the watershed tragedy of the Genocide in 1994 and regional security problems that caused the split. Today, the Region counts around 100 Jesuits, and more than 70% of them are still in formation. The average cost to train a Jesuit in Africa, per year, is \$9,000, and it takes about twelve years to form one Jesuit. During and after their training, Jesuits in Rwanda and Burundi actively work in education, services to help the poor, retreat centers, healing and reconciliation ministries,

HIV/AIDS ministry, Refugees Service, youth Ministries, vocation promotion, parish work, ecological and social justice programs. Please consider making a donation by scanning the QR code here:

PREVENTING GUN VIOLENCE

Beginning September 2024

Just Faith launched a new program on gun violence that the Social Justice ministry would like to offer in the fall if there is enough interest. Grounded in Christian faith, this program aspires to move beyond the divisive rhetoric of gun ownership versus gun control, instead inviting participants to discern solutions to the gun violence epidemic.

This program consists of eight virtual sessions, plus an immersion experience. All regular sessions include prayer, dialogue, active listening, weekly spiritual practices, and relationship-building. There is a small registration fee and you will need to purchase the book required for discussion. Space is limited to 10 participants. Sessions would begin in September and most likely be on Wednesday evenings at 7pm. Please e-mail *aklick@trinity.org* if you are interested.
