Back To School:

Embracing The Quiet Amidst The Excitement

As we peek around the corner to September, the halls of Holy Trinity School are gaining some chatter. The quiet we've seen all summer, as we work to prepare for the new school year, is replaced by teachers organizing classrooms, parents stopping by with questions, and students returning to the important work of learning.

It should come as no surprise that I, a lifelong learner, teacher, and now, school principal, love the Back to School season. I love lunchboxes and backpacks, school supplies, and even nudging my alarm clock a bit earlier each day to prepare for the shock of September.

But this year, I notice I am feeling the loss of the summer quiet. We give ourselves and our students such little time for quiet and the resulting peace even though we know it is valuable. As I welcomed the school faculty back to campus this month, I invited them to reflect on the ways we infuse our classrooms with Ignatian spirituality. We spent time together thinking about how we can be attentive, be reflective, and be loving, in all that we do for our students. Much of that comes in embracing quiet.

In being attentive, I ask myself to see what is before me. If I greet today's experiences with authenticity and love, I have an opportunity to meet each student where they are,



to see them. Perhaps to see them as truly as God sees them. One particularly joyful part of being a teacher is watching the student step across the threshold in September who has left behind whoever they were last June.

Children seem to instinctively embrace the energy of summer to grow and stretch themselves. They are, somehow, a bit more uncontained.



As teachers, I hope we can harness that and celebrate it: see what each student has brought with them to this year, and this classroom, and this day, and not only love them for it but help them to love it themselves. We want to bring some of the quiet that hot, heavy summer days provide naturally, and build in the space for students to continue to grow.

I've always found that silence fosters a sense of presence. It encourages mindfulness and helps us to fully experience the current moment, rather than being lost in regrets of the past or anxieties about the future. This presence can be especially grounding for our students as they experience the stress of adolescence. There is a profound beauty in this kind of attentiveness and reflection. Stillness plants seeds for genuine prayer. When we choose to embrace quiet, we invite ourselves to engage fully with our surroundings, our thoughts, and our faith, in a way that constant busyness rarely allows.

So as we bring back the chatter, the school spirit, the giggles, and the shouts of joy, we'll also be bringing

the quiet, the peace, and the moments of authentic connection. In these, I believe, our students will find grace, will feel wonder, and will leap forward along the path God has laid for each of them.

The first day of school at Holy Trinity is Tuesday, August 27. The uniform exchange will run August 23 - 30 in McKenna C.

PREVENTING GUN VIOLENCE

Beginning September 2024

Just Faith launched a new program on gun violence that the Social Justice ministry would like to offer in the fall if there is enough interest. Grounded in Christian faith, this program aspires to move beyond the divisive rhetoric of gun ownership versus gun control, instead inviting participants to discern solutions to the gun violence epidemic.

This program consists of eight virtual sessions, plus an immersion experience. All regular sessions include prayer, dialogue, active listening, weekly spiritual practices, and relationship-building. 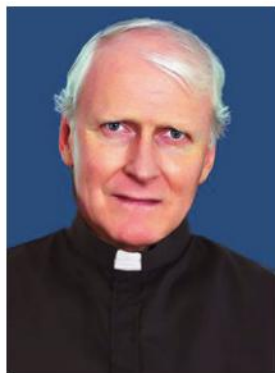




REMEMBERING FATHER PETER W. GYVES

Dr. Peter Gyves was a 38-year-old Holy Trinity parishioner in 1989 when he saw the invitation in the church bulletin to travel to the new mission outreach, “Maria Madre” in El Salvador. Peter was a pediatrician who was working at NIH and was very interested in joining the delegation.



In May, 1989, he joined Holy Trinity Pastor, Jim Maier, and four others on the first trip to El Salvador.

Peter’s week in “Maria Madre de Los Pobres” was profound. This parish in the slums was in the midst of a 10 year civil war where he witnessed great suffering of the poor, as well as their deep Catholic faith and hope for justice. It was at that time and place that Peter thought of becoming a Jesuit priest.

In early 1990, Peter left his prestigious position at NIH to live with the poor in El Salvador. He accompanied hundreds of people suffering from the ravages of the war.

He listened to their countless stories about their torture and bereavement in losing family members. In his jeep, he shuttled the sick, pregnant and severely injured from farming areas to the hospital into the capital city. He also spent time having lengthy theological discussions with the Jesuits at the University of Central America.

When he took his initial Jesuit vow at an advanced age for Jesuit novices, he made it known to the US Provincial that he wanted to work with God’s poor. He was assigned to work in the Central Africa Republic for a few months; in Guatemala for a year; at a poor parish in Jersey City for two years; and in a Hispanic community in San Diego for three years. It was there that he created his own ministry of “A Faith That Does Justice”.

He was eventually offered a wonderful opportunity to take his new ministry to the Boston area where had been living and working for more than a decade.

In early August, Peter fell ill and did not regain consciousness. He died on Wednesday, August 7th with his family, friends and fellow Jesuits surrounding him at Campion hospice in Weston, MA, just two weeks short of turning 73. He was comfortable and at peace.

Peter has given us all a great legacy of following the Gospel of Christ to live with and for God’s poor wherever we are.
