More Voices From Our Sister Parish, St. Jean Baptiste in Ansdeno, Haiti *The third in a series.*

I joined Holy Trinity in 2012 when my grandchildren started school there. One Sunday, Mission Sunday, I heard Kittie and Peter Fitzgerald speak about the newly-formed sister parish in Ansdeno, Haiti. They were planning a trip there in 2 weeks and I decided to go. It was my first of six trips.

Ansdeno is a beautiful town on the southwestern side of the island by the sea. The people are loving and welcoming and the children are enthusiastic and fun. But the town is extremely poor.

We met with Pere Medard, the Pastor of St. Jean Baptiste Church, the pastoral council which consisted of men and women in various positions in the town, and the director of the school, St. Raymond's. We asked each of them to list and prioritize their needs.

It was easy to decide on our first project. There was a rusted motor in the dirt next to the rectory, part of a small agricultural mill that would grind corn and hull rice. With the help of Holy Trinity's tithe, we were able to purchase a new motor and build an enclosure to protect the mill from the rain. The farmers would pay a small amount to use



the mill, and that money was used to buy gas to run the motor. It still is in use today! That was our first sustainable success story.

The coffee farmers had stopped growing their coffee due to middlemen taking most of the profits from selling the beans. We heard about a fair trade coffee business, Just Haiti, being used in another part of Haiti. With the help from the HT tithe we were able to purchase hundreds of starter coffee plants and small farming tools. Starting with 25 farmers and instructions from Just Haiti, the farmers were able to start their own coffee association. They elected three officers and opened a bank account. They expanded

the Association to 50 farmers. They brought the coffee beans to Port-au Prince, and Just Haiti paid them a fair price for the beans. The beans were flown to Baltimore, processed, and bagged. We then brought the coffee to Holy Trinity to sell. The profits from the sale went back to the farmers. This was our second sustainable success story.

There were many projects for the school, but the students really wanted computers. We found a Haitian company that installed computer labs. With a grant from the Holy Trinity Social Justice committee, we were able to install a computer lab with 24 workstations, all solar powered.

Unfortunately, due to the current level of dangerous gang activity we have not been able to visit our sister parish since 2018. But we have not given up. In the school, we are continuing our scholarship program, preparing to increase electric power, and working on installing internet access, which is now less expensive to operate. This will be done as soon as it is safe to do the work.

Holy Trinity's St. Jean Baptiste Haiti Committee started a partnership with Food for the Poor, (FFTP) an organization that has been working in Haiti for many years. FFTP agreed to provide free food for the school. We worked with FFTP to build 31 new houses and 2 community centers. One of the community centers replaced a chapel that was destroyed in Hurricane Matthew. This chapel was the setting for 31 weddings that Holy Trinity supported, including providing wedding gowns for the brides!

The SJB Haiti Committee sends 2 or 3 barrels of needed supplies twice a year to our sister parish. In the past we have sent school supplies, basketballs, volleyballs, and soccer balls for the school PE program. As well, we send new soccer uniforms for the girls' and boys' soccer teams. There are toys donated through Holy Trinity's Giving Tree Program, making Christmas happier for so many children at our sister parish. French and English books by the hundreds are donated to the school library. Hundreds of chemical-free feminine products are sent to the school. We have also assembled birthing kits and newborn kits

for midwives in local clinics.

The last 2 barrels we sent are currently sitting in the port at Port au Prince, to be picked up when it is safe to travel there. It will then take hours get the donations to St. Jean Baptiste in a pickup truck via dirt roads.

Pere Lesly, the new pastor of St. Jean Baptiste, would like to thank Holy Trinity for all that you have done and are still doing. Pere Lesly has a special request- "Please Pray For Us." *Mèsi anpil!* (Thank you very much!)

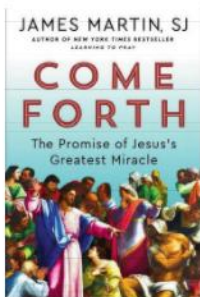

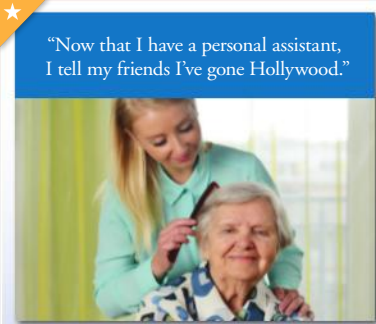

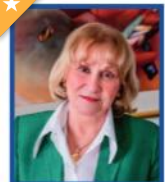
