Meet Father Jack Dennis – “A Jesuit Priest For Normal Catholics” By Father Jack Dennis, S.J.

My full name is John Murray Dennis, Jr., S.J., and I am named after my father, who was a wonderful dad and doctor, the Dean of the University of Maryland Medical School, for many years. I was born and raised, with three siblings, in Towson, MD, a suburb north of Baltimore City, by my mom (who is now a vibrant 98-year old!) and my dad.

I was educated in Catholic schools, from kindergarten (St. Mary’s Govans) through college (Villanova University). My vocation was born early in grade school, but really began blossoming in high school, at Loyola Blakefield, where I met and befriended many young Jesuit Scholastics, who were my teachers.

After college, I became a Jesuit Volunteer, in urban Philadelphia, working as a Community Organizer, in a largely forgotten neighborhood. It was the most transformational year of my life thus far, working hand-in-hand with a community that lacked the most basic needs I took for granted: water, heat, employment, and the like.

I entered the Maryland Province of the Society of Jesus the following year, becoming a Jesuit novice for two years. I then studied Philosophy at Fordham University ... taught Algebra and Geometry at Gonzaga College High School

(DC) ... developed communication skills at WWL-TV, in New Orleans ... received a Master’s in Theology from the Jesuit School of Theology, in Berkeley, CA ... and received a Master’s in Secondary Education Administration from Harvard University.

I have loved most of the places I have lived, and the ministries

to which I have been missioned as a Jesuit, but the two I am probably most proud of are my two Jesuit high school Presidencies, at Loyola Blakefield (Baltimore) and Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School (Indianapolis). I feel I was able to make an institutional impact, as well as a personal impact, at each school. I don't have my name on a room or structure at either school; yet both Blakefield and Brebeuf Jesuit are indelibly etched on my heart.

I have also worked as the Director of Campus Ministry and Chaplain at Loyola University Maryland, for which I was well-suited. I loved implementing new retreats for the students and worked with both girls' and boys' varsity and club athletic teams, on the side. Spiritual Retreats are especially essential for young guys, as it gives them the license and opportunity to tap into the affective sides of their hearts – often for the very first time.

My international traveling has been mainly limited to El Salvador and the Dominican Republic, where I fell in love with the most extraordinary people in these two countries. St. Oscar Romero, the Archbishop of El Salvador, is my personal hero, and I often pray with and homilize from his writings on freedom, justice,

peace, love and community. Romero touches my soul in a way that no other saint ever has – he gifts me with life and light and joy and hope.

I never seriously considered being a parish priest until I spent a bit of time last spring assisting at the Church of the Nativity in Timonium, MD. When you spend the bulk of your adult life in Jesuit education, the opportunity for continuous Sacramental Ministry becomes a bit elusive. At Nativity, I participated fully in a vibrant schedule of daily Masses, Weddings, Funerals, Baptisms, Reconciliation, and so on, and I found it all incredibly fulfilling.

I was both surprised and delighted when my Jesuit Provincial assigned me to be a Parochial Vicar, assisting Fr. Gillespie here at Holy Trinity Parish, in March 2024.

These past months have been a joy for me, as I have begun getting to know and love the ministry and community at Trinity. How could one not love suddenly living in Georgetown, and working in such a prestigious, impactful and loving ministry? Each Mass I celebrate has its own distinctive spiritual flavor here, and I sense the real presence of Jesus – God's Christ – in our work, our prayer and our presence.

I have always considered myself 'a Jesuit priest for normal Catholics,' and what I mean by that is that I am a simple man and priest who understands the joys and heartache we all go through in life. I actively listen to what you share with God and me in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and often think to myself: "*Wow. That's me, too.*"

Thank you for welcoming me to this amazing community of hope and love. Thank you for making me feel a sense of belonging to your great and wonderful Holy Trinity Parish. Thank you from the bottom of my heart.
