Greetings Holy Trinity Family!

I would like to thank you for greeting and welcoming me since I have started my position as Coordinator of Youth Ministry. Everyone I have met so far has been very friendly and kind and encouraging. Seeing the support of a loving community is very important and a testament to the faith of the people and what is to come.

I was born and raised in Baltimore City to Jamaican parents. I graduated from Morgan State University with a degree in Mathematics, but all my work experience has been in ministry. Starting off as a volunteer, I began working part-time in youth and young adult ministry at my home parish of Blessed Sacrament. My first full-time position would expand my position to include the parishes of St. Mary's Govans and St. Matthew.

During my time there, I would work for as many as seven(!) parishes together as part of the Northeast Catholic Community (NECC) and I have experienced so much growth over the years working there, including the importance of collaboration, synodality, and solidarity. The NECC was very much dedicated to social justice and is how I became involved in racial justice work. The spirit of the community and the opportunities provided are



something I carry with me wherever I go.

Over the years, I have been able to be involved in some great initiatives. I have served on various regional and national committees to be an advocate and representative for youth and young adults and even had the opportunity to speak at the Bishops Fall assembly in 2022 about *Journeying Together: A National Catholic Intercultural Encounter for Ministries with Youth and Young Adults*. These experiences have helped shape my own faith journey and introduced me to many wonderful people.

Speaking of wonderful people, if you ask me what sustains my being (outside of my love of music), it is my friends and family. My Black Catholic Young Adult and Journeying Together Families and my recreational soccer team (hey Bobson!) have very special places in my heart and are essential lifelines of support. Mentorship from youth ministry veterans such as Ansel Augustine and Ronald Landfair have offered me advice, encouragement, and provided me with many opportunities over the years. My home parish and ministry friends back home have also been a blessing. I am thankful for all the people who are in my life and have brought clarity and sincerity to the work that I have set out to do.

My understanding of my role as a youth minister has changed over time. At first, it was about programming that would help them grow in faith and community. As my experience in ministry has grown, I have realized there is more to do. Today I know my mission is to help young people to be active, transformative, faith-filled participants of their own environments and the larger world. This includes everything said before but expands to more leadership formation, opportunities to lead, and advocacy of their presence in all areas of parish life.

In his exhortation *Christus Vivit*, Pope Francis says, “[64] ...we cannot just say that young people are the future of our world. They are its present; even now, they are helping to enrich it.” The work of youth ministry must be to make this a reality in every space. Like Jesus in the Emmaus story, adult leaders are called to accompany young people: to walk alongside them and listen, to help them discern what is happening in

their lives and to help them choose what paths to take in life. Because each person is at a different point in their faith journey, it requires all of us as members of this faith community to be dynamic and have open hearts to meet them where they are and offer perpetual support. To make that last statement a reality, we are all required to be a part of youth ministry in some way - not only for the sake of rising to the current realities of our young people, but for the fulfillment of the mission of Holy Trinity.

Thank you once again for the opportunity to be a part of this community. As a young person, I also hope to discern how best to use my gifts to help enrich an already strong community at Holy Trinity. May the gifts of the Holy Spirit work through us to help us grow together in faith, understanding, and love so that we can continue the work of transforming lives. Amen! Amen! Amen!

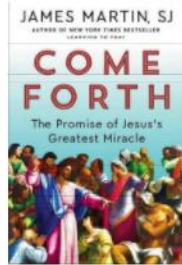

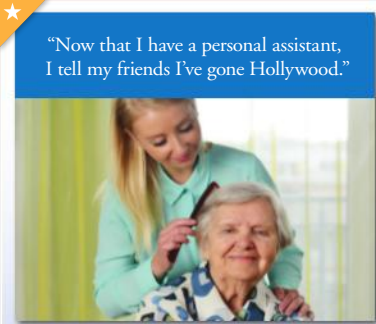

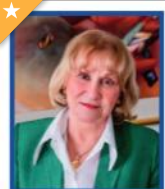
