FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"FATHER, YOU ARE FIT TO GO."

Hello again!

"Father, you are fit to go." With these words, the doctor in charge of Jesuit health gave me the okay to return to Holy Trinity on Monday, the 23rd of September. As many of you know, July 18, almost ten weeks ago, I had open-heart surgery for an arterial aneurysm followed two weeks later by cardioversion procedure for atrial fibrillation. Needless to say, it has been quite a summer. Now at the start of autumn which coincides with the 9th anniversary of my arriving at Holy Trinity, I leave rehabilitation here at the Colombiere Jesuit Community in Baltimore.

Before returning I will enter into a 7-day silent retreat here at Colombiere when I hope to uncover the many consolations of this journey to recovery and prepare for some of the challenges ahead of me.

There have certainly been many graced consolations for which I am thankful. The doctors, nurses and other caregivers at two hospitals were instruments of consolation. At the Washington Hospital Center, where I

had the open-heart surgery and spent a week in recovery, I encountered more than a dozen medical folks who assisted my initial stages of recovery with competence as well as encouragement. I still remember walking down a hospital corridor with a physical therapist holding my gown as a way of supporting my every step.

Similarly, at Union Memorial Hospital here in Baltimore where I had the cardioversion, the physicians and nurses encouraged my bold steps toward recovery. I should note, however, at both hospitals I came to dread the regular needle pricks, often done in early morning, so as to monitor and determine which medications and dosage were needed. Needless to say, I will not miss these daily needles!

For the past month I have also found consolation in the cardio therapy team at Union Memorial. Three times a week I have an hour-long workout supervised by one of a half dozen trainers. Their encouragement and humor have served to enhance my resilience and strength.

And then there have been many spiritual consolations experienced while living with twenty of my fellow Jesuits at Columbiere, as well as the caregiving and medical staff here. Having 24-7 care certainly has been a blessing.

As I reflect about the past two months, I would be remiss if I did not mention that I have been consoled by the dedicated and steady ministry of my colleagues. The work

of my fellow Jesuit companions, our parish staff and countless volunteers have been consoling and encouraging. Their/your labors demonstrate how so much of our ministry at Holy Trinity is a collaborative community of faith.

When praying over these numerous consoling encounters, it occurred to me to ask the question, how did they happen? Certainly one of the reasons is that so many people like yourselves have been praying for me. Thank you!

I should also note that during this journey I have prayed to The Sacred Heart in the mantra, "May your Heart heal my heart."

Throughout my recovery, I have had to learn adapt to my body and recognize what I can and can't do, at least not yet. There are three areas of concern. Since the surgery I have not had the full use of my left hand as a nerve was strained, making parts of my hand numb. Also, for much of the rehabilitation I have had a persistent, often intense cough, which has placed stress on my vocal cords, resulting in a softer voice. I pray that both these ailments will eventually be resolved.

A final concern, of course, is building up my resiliency and overall strength. They were tested this past Saturday when I presided at Mass for the first time in more than 2 months. Fortunately, I felt energized and my liturgical self emerged confident that I can, indeed, preside like I have done for the past 38 years.

Finally, friends, as I prepare to return to Holy Trinity and begin my tenth year of ministry here, I face the challenges ahead encouraged by so many consoling graces.

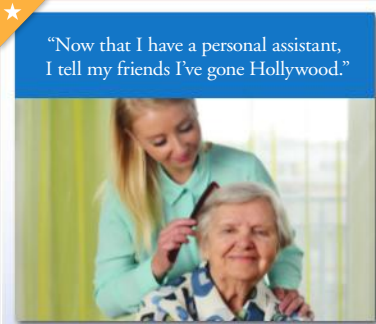

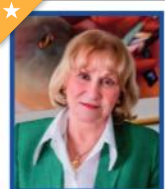
