A Slow Walk Toward Justice

Migrant Team Accompanies our Brothers and Sisters in Need

The last Sunday in September is recognized by the Church as the World Day of Migrants and Refugees – celebrated since 1914.

Soon after she crossed our border, three-year-old Aslihan entered a San Diego hospital—listless, dehydrated, and undernourished.

Her worried Afghan parents had carried the little girl through eleven countries—seeking both refuge from a reconstituted Taliban, and medical care for their daughter, who has profound cerebral palsy.

Early this spring, a call from Catholic Charities introduced us to this fragile family, then nearing the end of their time-limited stay in a Maryland shelter.

When the Holy Trinity Migrant Team considers a family for support, two questions inform our choice:

Do we have the funds to house a new family until work permission arrives?

Moreover, do we have volunteer mentors to guide the family towards independence—to connect them with



affordable housing, resources for food, schools for the children, English classes for the adults, job training, legal advice, and—crucially—medical care?

This discernment is never easy; for Aslihan and her parents, it was weighted with the knowledge they would require a network of overlapping medical expertise: in neurology, physical medicine, pulmonology, audiology—and in

specialties we knew we couldn't predict.

Simple nutrition would be a challenge for this little girl, for whom swallowing is hard. Countless hours would be required to untangle the options and restrictions of insurance accessibility, and applications for financial relief.

With care, and a miles-long leap of faith, our medical team—our department of miracles—said, “Yes.”

Aslihan has a customized wheelchair now, boosting her interaction with the world. Through the Children's Hospital Complex Care clinic—and our team's time-intensive support—she has multiple physicians collaborating on her growth and potential.

She's begun to gain weight. And she's been evaluated for placement by a Montgomery County special education team—an unthinkable privilege in her homeland, which severely restricts most education for girls.

Happily, none of Aslihan's challenges eclipse her sweet smile. None of her parents' worries diminish the grace of their hospitality. We are always greeted with tea and pistachios or a thinly sliced fig, rationed and preserved in gratitude for our visits.

All the families we serve require medical support—frequently after years on the rough road to safe haven. Mental health needs—sometimes stigmatized in their countries of origin—emerge once families finally feel physically safe.

Our medical team, led by parishioner and nurse practitioner Mary McCabe, works nimbly and indefatigably—and warmly invites all those called to this ministry of care.

Our newest family are Venezuelans, in flight from their country's violence and economic collapse. Upon arrival in our region, Mariana, Yoander, and three-year-old Jhoannys slept on a DC street, outside a shelter whose beds were full.

News from their homeland is grim: family members have disappeared from chat threads on WhatsApp,

likely detained by their country's merciless regime.

Here in DC, they are grateful for a roof above their heads, directions to food pantries, and a preschool that brings stability to a little boy whose short life has seen almost none.

Our team works only with newcomers adhering fully to US immigration law. But policies are in perpetual flux and laws can be inscrutable to those trying earnestly to comply.

We're thankful for law firm pro-bono help, and for our partnership with non-profits, such as Arlington's Restoration Immigration Legal Aid. But the need for legal services is overwhelming, and resources are scarce.

For families like Mariana and Yoander's, work permission can come only after asylum applications are filed—and so we pay immigration attorneys to move the process toward that goal. Legal fees follow housing as our second-largest expense.

The Holy Trinity Migrant Team took root in 2018, after parishioners visited the border—and came home to a milieu in which our faith's essential mandate—loving our neighbors—was occluded by a rhetoric of exclusion, and policies that were cruel.

We began in the trust that the slow walk toward justice is best trod through deep immersion in the lives of those marginalized, vilified, or bereft.

To this ministry of challenge—and of unflappable hope—we wholeheartedly welcome all, and give thanks for all gifts of treasure, professional talent, and valuable time.

We have seen this work transform hearts, most indelibly our own.
