How Do We Make *Laudato Si'* Happen Here? Solar Panel Project Is Dedicated By Holy Trinity Staff

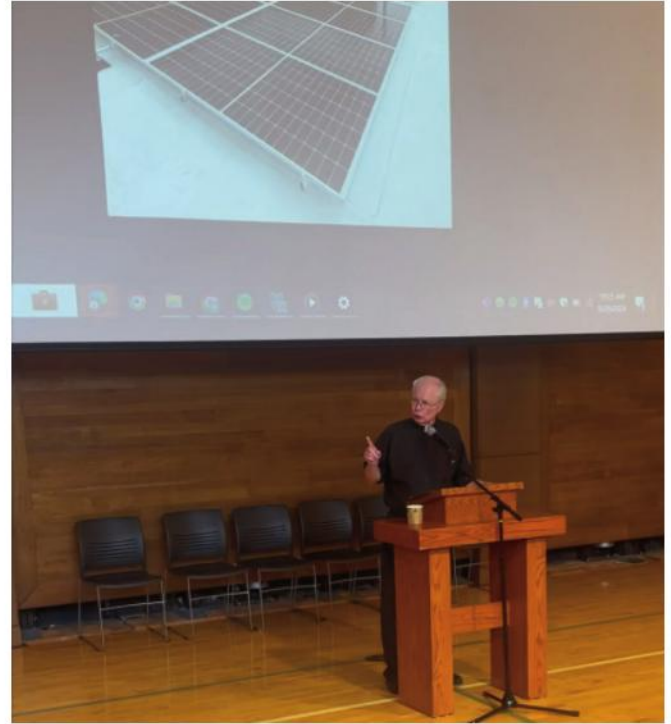
Last Sunday, the Holy Trinity community gathered in Trinity Hall to dedicate the solar panel project, which has been installed and is set to go live in the coming weeks.

Father Gillespie was joined by several speakers, and all discussed the long path that went from an official Vatican proclamation to the installation of solar panels on the roofs of Holy Trinity School.

In his 2015 Encyclical *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis issued an “urgent challenge to protect our common home,” and called for “a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet.”

Joseph Lucco, chair of the parish facilities committee, noted, “For many, the encyclical was a call to action and a reminder that in caring for our environment both now and for future generations, we are honoring and praising God.”

At the dedication, Father Gillespie recalled visiting Holy Trinity in the autumn of 2015, before his official assignment here, as the social justice team was meeting in Trinity Hall to discuss how to take action on the encyclical.



“Kate Tromble, Ashley Klick’s predecessor, held a meeting on the Encyclical right here in Trinity Hall. She was on the vanguard of *Laudato Si'*,” Father Gillespie said.

“For a year, my colleagues and I would meet and we would ask, ‘Alright, what are we doing? How do we make *Laudato Si'* happen here in the parish?’” Father Gillespie said.

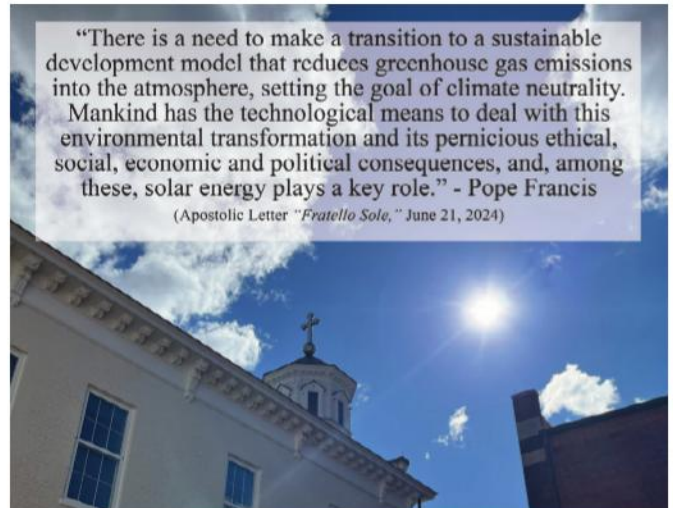
John Hisle of the Green Team noted, “*Laudato Si'* is dedicated to St. Francis of Assisi, who intuitively understood that we are all part of this wondrous creative gift from God called universe.”

In 2019, members of the Green Team, the facilities committee, and others attended an open house at Our Lady Queen of Peace in Arlington, which had just installed solar panels. The group came away from that visit and decided that Holy Trinity should go solar.

Holy Trinity School was going to be a big part of the project, as the panels would need to be installed on the Upper and Lower School roofs.

Indeed, the HTS Classes of 2021, 2022, and 2023 ended up donating almost \$50,000 toward the cost of the solar project. Holy Trinity School principal Katy Williams remarked, “Our students at Holy Trinity School are always calling us to consider our actions in light of care for God’s creation.”

Holy Trinity began working in earnest to get the solar panel project going, but the going was not easy. Of course, 2020 brought COVID-19 – and with it, shutdowns, supply chain issues, and other delays. The usual construction delays and red tape were also



factors, but the project team persevered, and final adjustments are now being made before the official permission is given to go live.

And now, the hard work done by all of those involved in the project can serve as an example for others.

“We’ve created a model here at Holy Trinity other parishes in the diocese and around the county can follow as they endeavor to go solar,” said Joseph Lucco.

Katy Williams considered the project a gift for future generations. “One of the aspects of our community I find inspiring is that many of our parents today were once Holy Trinity students themselves,” Williams said. “I cannot help but think as our students celebrate this great step today, their own children, too, will benefit in the years to come.”

Father Gillespie blessed the solar panel project at the conclusion of the ceremony:

O God, from the very beginning of time you commanded the earth to bring forth vegetation and fruit of every kind.

Grant, we pray, that these solar panels, the work of human hands and made possible by the generous benefactors of this project, harmonize with all of your creation so that the air we breathe and the fruits of the earth may flourish according to your will.

Then your people, enriched by the beauty that comes from you, will praise you unceasingly now and for ages unending. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
