Walking A Path Of Faith And Service by Christopher Dake, Director of Advancement & Stewardship

If a picture is worth a thousand words, then the one you're looking at has plenty to say. Yes, that's me, Christopher Dake, on May 6, 1990, decked out in my purple sport coat, skinny white tie, hair combed to perfection, and a camera flash frozen in time as I stood proudly next to a tree I had received back in the 4th grade—the first year I attended St. Pius X Catholic school in Reynoldsburg, Ohio, after years of attending what fellow Gen-Xers would remember as "CCD."

That day, I was confirmed, fully embracing the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and I began walking a path that would always bring me back to faith and service. I took the name Ignatius because my siblings had attended Jesuit schools, and the story of a soldier who sought humility to serve God resonated with me.

Since then, my journey has been guided by the ideals of Ignatian spirituality and has been deeply rooted in Jesuit teachings. Service has been at the heart of every step, from St. Charles Preparatory School to Xavier University. My faith shaped a career focused on various roles in nonprofits, from the Kennedy Center to Catholic Charities, the SHARE Food Network, and CCS Fundraising, always concentrating on fostering community and promoting social justice.



But let's not focus too much on the questionable fashion choices of 1990, nor what can be read on my LinkedIn profile. Instead, let's talk about the future.



Our HTS Journey

There are events that occur in one's life that happen not by mere chance, but rather by God's providence. In March 2011, our daughter, Anne-Sophie, was four years old, and our youngest child, Noé, was eight months old. My spouse and I worked respectively in Virginia and Washington, DC and were desperately looking for a school in Washington for our daughter. As I was coming from a meeting and rushing to get to work, I avoided the traffic on Wisconsin Avenue, thinking that I would get to the office sooner. Not being familiar with the neighborhood, I got lost. As I traced my way back to the main road, I stumbled onto a building that appeared to be a school. I stopped there to verify this and, if it was a school, to inquire about registration.



To my astonishment, it was indeed a school, and a Catholic one at that. Its name was Holy Trinity School (HTS). I had not had a chance to do any research on its curriculum, let alone on the cost of tuition. Taking a leap of faith, I went

in and inquired about registration. I was told that, unfortunately, registration was closed, and acceptance letters were already being sent out to parents. But upon hearing that I was seeking my daughter's admission into the kindergarten class, the admissions director handed me an application and requested that I fill it out immediately. As I did so, I heard an inner voice whispering: "Your daughter belongs here."


Back at work, I did a quick search and discovered that HTS was a Jesuit school with numerous afterschool programs. I could not have been happier, because the Jesuits were well-known in the field of education. Two days after submitting the application, an acceptance letter had been mailed. We were overjoyed, because we knew we had made the best decision for educating our daughter! Fast-forward to four years later, our youngest son, Noé, was accepted into HTS' pre-K.

Providing our kids with the best education is our highest priority, because we know that education is a wealth no one can rob them of. Holy Trinity epitomizes all the characteristics we ever looked for in a school. It is a place that held our kids to high standards, a place where they were challenged, motivated and provided with the support necessary to excel. A place where faculty and administrators worked jointly with us for the wellbeing of our children, where our kids developed selfconfidence, learned about leadership and expressed their thoughts freely. A place where they were taught to examine themselves daily. Anne-Sophie and Noé took the Examen seriously and, to quote them, it was, "a time to reflect on our day and highlight the things we did - good or bad - and, if we did bad, we would think about what to change in the future or how to take responsibility for our actions; this moment allowed us to center ourselves and focus on being the best we could be moving forward."

HTS is a community of faith that cares about people and embraces those from all walks of life. Our family knows firsthand of the love, kindness and generosity of this community, which supported us and carried us through the darkest time of our lives: the sickness and untimely passing of my husband, Harry. HTS is, lastly, a place that reinforced the value we taught our children at home: that they should be "people for others," that they should show acts of kindness by caring for others and trying to understand what other people might be going through and doing what they could to help.

Having our kids attend HTS was not our own choice; it was God's choice for our family. HTS has given my children a solid foundation, which enabled Anne-Sophie ('20) to thrive at Georgetown Visitation, maintaining honor-roll status throughout her four years there. She is currently a freshman at Fordham University and is well prepared to tackle the challenges that lie ahead. Noé ('24) is a freshman at Gonzaga College High School and has started out on a good note. I would be remiss if I did not take this opportunity to thank the entire HTS community - namely, the faculty, the administrators, the Pastor and the priests, the support staff at all levels, the parents and all the students - who have contributed one way or another to making my two
