Ignatian Spirituality Project: Transforming Lives

Sonya describes her recent experience with an Ignatian Spirituality Project (ISP) retreat. The Project "invites people recovering from homelessness and addiction to encounter God's love, hope and healing through spiritual companionship that transforms lives."

The work of the Project is based on the intersection of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius and 12 step recovery programs. Both encourage individuals to develop a personal relationship with the God of their understanding and to find him in their daily lives. Through this connection, individuals build and strengthen a spiritual foundation for recovery.

ISP was founded in 1998 by Fr. Bill Creed, S.J. and Ed Shurma, former Executive Director of the Chicago Coalition for the Homeless, both of whom were "seeking a way to care for the spiritual life of the homeless." Although grounded in Jesuit traditions, ISP welcomes people of all faiths to its programs. Since its founding, ISP has expanded to 20 cities in the U.S., Canada and Ireland,



and has served over 20,000 individuals. The network is supported by more than 600 volunteers.

In 2007, Fr. Creed reached out to Fr. Kevin O'Brien, former Holy Trinity associate pastor, with the hope of launching an ISP affiliate in the DC area. Parishioner Karen Clifton recruited other Holy Trinity volunteers, as well as a few women from Holy Trinity Social Justice grant recipients who housed the homeless. This resulted in Evelene Duhart from N St. Village becoming a founding member of the ISP-DC team.

The group led the first women's retreat in March 2009,

followed by the first men's retreat a month later. The retreats have been held at Loyola on the Potomac Retreat House in Faulkner, MD since. ISP-DC serves houses across the DC area, including: N St. Village, S.O.M.E. (21 houses), New Endeavors, Samaritan Inn and many others. We are currently expanding to other houses in the area.

Evelene shares, "ISP was and is the gift my Higher Power gave me." Evelene currently serves as a both a leader on the DC team and for the entire ISP Network, participating in ISP's Ambassadors of Hope leadership development program, along with Frances Kummer, DC Team Co-Leader. For the ISP team, Evelene is the gift that God gave us.

Jerome Thomas, retreatant and current co-coordinator of the men's team, describes his first retreat: "I needed to be able to talk about my experiences in a way that no one was judging; they just heard it, received it, and walked along with me."

Retreats form the keystone of the ISP ministry, inviting women and men (all retreats are single gender) to accompany each other on the path to healing. These individuals, many of whom have never met before, gather for a three day retreat at Loyola on the Potomac. The environment offers a respite from everyday life, allowing for prayer and intense reflection. The time and trusting space create the space for God to work.

Participants and ISP Team members are invited to be open, honest and bear witness to each other's personal stories. Through these shared experiences, participants develop friendships which sustain us on our paths to recovery. All of us move from hopelessness to hope.

"I was drawn to ISP by how closely the Project mirrors my own recovery and spiritual journeys. As I work through the Exercises and the 12 steps, it's increasingly clear how intertwined the two are for me. My first retreat this September was a profound, poignant experience, unlike any other I have encountered. As the retreat unfolded, the commonality of our stories emerged and was a reminder that we are all unconditionally loved by God. We are brought together to build a community of faith, hope and healing." (Felicia Ganote, HT Parishioner and Team Member)

ISP offers additional programs to support alumni. One month after each retreat, participants reunite to nurture the bonds formed during their time together. Monthly reflection sessions provide opportunities for further spiritual accompaniment. New attendees are introduced to the mission and work of ISP. These sessions are currently held at N St. Village and the Conway Center.

ISP-DC is grateful for the generosity of the Holy Trinity community. The program is sponsored by the Ignatian Spirituality and Prayer Ministry, a Social Justice Tithe grant as well as many individual donors. Parishioners also write letters of support, donate stuffed animals and toiletries and knit prayer shawls for retreatants.

We invite you to join us for the Women of Advent Simple Supper, Thursday, December 5 at 6:30 PM in McKenna Hall. Program alumni, current participants and volunteers will gather to share their experiences.

Frances Kummer, HT Parishioner and DC Team Co-Leader, discusses her introduction to ISP: "I attended my first Simple Supper in 2015 and was immediately drawn to the women who attended. In listening to the women, all I knew is that I wanted to be a part of this. ISP is movement from doing 'for' someone to partnership in each other's transformations towards God's love and healing."
