Adult Faith Formation for a Synodal Parish

The Final Document of the Synod on Synodality last month emphasized the importance of continuing formation for all the members of the church in order to grow in our own faith and in order to be missionary disciples who can share that faith with others. The Assembly wrote that “the formation provided by the Christian community [must] be integral, ongoing and shared,” and that “such formation must aim not only at acquiring theoretical knowledge but also at promoting the capacity for openness and encounter, sharing and collaboration, reflection and discernment in common.”

In this vision, adult faith formation isn't like taking a class to learn new knowledge or a new skill, or to pass some sort of test. Rather, talking with each other about how we understand our faith and learning more about what we believe can be, itself, an act of prayer – a way of loving God “with all our mind” by providing a space for our curiosity, questioning, and dialogue about what we believe.

So much adult faith formation already happens in our parish, such as our book discussion group, social justice programs like JustFaith, and our offerings in Ignatian



spirituality. We hope that you've noticed in recent weeks our attempts at providing additional learning opportunities, like our panel on the Synod on Synodality and the session on Advent: More Than a Wreath we're holding this weekend in person on Sunday and on Zoom on Monday.

As the Adult Faith Formation Consultant for the parish, I'm working to continue in the coming months to provide

more options for exploring what we believe that are *accessible, conversational, and relevant.*

Accessible – we all have astoundingly busy lives. Whether you’re caring for children or others in your family, managing a busy professional life, or already participating in other ministries here at the parish, your time is valuable, and often over-scheduled before you even begin the week! We’re trying to provide as many options as possible to meet you where you are. You’ll notice that we’ll try to offer programming both in person and on Zoom, and we’ll be experimenting with different times, and varying those times, to serve the needs of as many of our parishioners as possible. That won’t always work for everyone, but we hope that we’ll be able to have a variety of times and modalities so that you always have options.

Conversational – the theologian Jane Regan, whose research specializes in adult faith formation, writes that “adult faith formation is not exclusively about information; it is primarily about providing opportunities, within a faith context, for adults to talk with other adults about things that matter.” As a Catholic, you already know a lot about your faith – probably more than you think! So while we’ll continue to invite expert speakers and folks with specialized knowledge to share that with us, we’re also aiming to prioritize conversations that allow us to think through our faith together.

Relevant – “One of the main goals of faith formation,” Angela Howard-McPartland wrote, “is how to be Catholic when you’re not at Mass.” We’re hoping that our faith formation opportunities will be of immediate relevance on your own faith journey when you’re not at Mass, as you’re asking your own questions, as you’re talking with family, colleagues, or friends, and as we discern together how to be missionary disciples. Specialized knowledge for its own sake is great, but more appropriate for academia – here at the parish, we’re hoping to give you the space to bring “life to faith and faith to life,” in the words of theologian Thomas Groome, and to give you more resources to think through our shared faith in a God who loves us.

To make this successful, I’ll be grateful for your continued input and assistance. I’m always available at brian.flanagan@trinity.org, or to meet up in person or on Zoom, and would love to hear more about the kinds of programming and topics that you would like to see in our parish. I hope that you’ll join us for an upcoming event so that we can continue to grow as the synodal parish of missionary disciples that Pope Francis is inviting us to be.

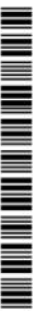
