## *Mahalo Nui Loa For Welcoming Me* By Deacon Christopher Derige Malano, CSP

*Aloha!* My name is Deacon Christopher Derige Malano, CSP – you may have seen me around Holy Trinity. I am a seminarian of the Paulist Fathers, the first Catholic religious community of men established in the USA. This is my second year with you and I have been learning a lot through my involvement in the life of the community and in my interactions with you. In late August of this year I made my Final Profession (for life) as a member of the Paulist community and was ordained a deacon in early September.

I was born and raised in the beautiful islands of Hawaii, with its sunny beaches, lush mountains, and a rich tapestry of cultures that shaped me into who I am today. My family has deep roots in the Filipino and Hawaiian communities. Growing up in this cultural quilt taught me to appreciate the beauty of connection and how each thread contributes to the larger fabric of a diverse community.



Faith has always been an anchor in my life. My parents' simple but steadfast devotion introduced me to the rhythms of a faith-filled life. As I grew older, my faith became more personal, especially during my college years when I started asking deeper questions about purpose and meaning. Those questions eventually led me to discover the joy of serving others and finding Christ in all people.

Before answering the call to ministry, I worked in Catholic campus ministry at the University of Hawaii – Manoa (formerly a Jesuit parish), where I worked as the Pastoral Administrator and campus minister. I also had the incredible privilege of serving as the Secretary General for the International Movement of Catholic Students – Pax Romana (IMCS), a global student movement dedicated to faith, justice, and community-building. Through this role, I had the chance to connect with young Catholics from around the world, learning about their struggles, hopes, and dreams. These experiences deepened my love for the Church’s global mission and showed me the profound ways God is at work in all corners of the earth. At Holy Trinity there are people from around the world and it reminds me of my time in the student movement.

My path to becoming a Paulist was not something I saw coming when I was younger. But over time, the gentle whisper of God’s call grew louder. I realized that my love for accompanying others, especially those who felt disconnected or on the margins, was pulling me toward religious life. The Paulists’ mission of outreach, dialogue, and evangelization felt like a great fit for me, and I entered formation in 2019. My first masters degree is an MA in Global Development and Social Justice from St. John’s University (Rome). For ordination, I’m about to complete a second masters, this time a Master of Divinity at The Catholic University of America.

In ministry, I’m especially passionate about helping people discover how deeply loved they are by God. I love creating spaces where people feel they truly belong, whether it’s through a heartfelt conversation, a shared prayer, or simply listening to their story. My cultural background taught me the value of hospitality and the joy of building bridges between people. These are important values here at Holy Trinity and I think that’s why I really enjoy serving here!

When I’m not at church or studying, I enjoy exploring the city, reading about the intersection of faith and culture, or reconnecting with my Hawaiian roots

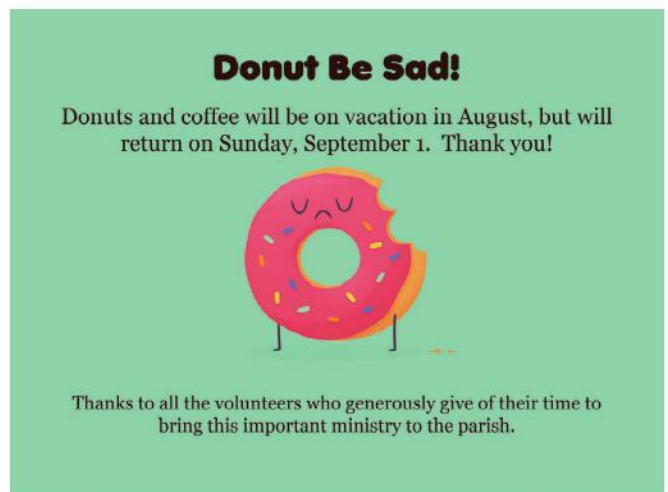
(though I can’t promise I’ll be bringing *poi* – pounded taro root – to every parish event).

## Young Adults And The Parish Pledge

I was searching for a new parish in early 2021 when a couple of friends recommended Holy Trinity. I had been living in the DC area since 2015, but didn't feel like I had found my "home" parish and a place where I felt part of the community. This longing for belonging and connection was especially strong during the pandemic, and I felt like my faith was central to how I wanted to find purpose and fellowship in my life.

My friends told me Holy Trinity had a vibrant young adult community and was known for being an active and social justice driven parish. I signed up for the young adult newsletter and was thrilled to receive a personal welcome email from the co-chairs of the Young Adult Community (YAC).

I was immediately drawn to the number of opportunities the YACs had available for both service and social events. I started attending the YAC's weekly faith sharing session to discuss the upcoming Sunday Gospel and volunteered with the Saturday Suppers ministry to prepare meals for those experiencing homelessness in the Georgetown area.

Even though I was new, I felt incredibly welcomed and noticed how many YACs introduced themselves, invited me to sit with them at Mass and get dinner afterwards, and shared how else I could get involved. These experiences not only deepened my faith, but also fulfilled my desire for a shared connection with fellow Catholic young adults.

I joined the YAC Steering Committee in 2022 as one of the co-chairs for the social justice committee and now serve as one of the co-chairs for the overall committee. I felt called to serve in leadership because of the welcoming experience I had when I joined the YACs and wanting to help foster that environment for others new to the parish and for the entire community.

I greatly appreciate that at Holy Trinity, young adults have a voice and seat at the table in the broader parish. During the Synod listening sessions in 2022, YACs not only participated in the parish-wide sessions, but also had a dedicated session for young adults to directly capture our thoughts on the direction, mission, and outreach of the Catholic Church. As part of our YAC leadership roles, we also participate as members of the social justice, liturgy, spirituality, and parish life committees and have participated in feedback sessions for the parish's Strategic Plan.

I met my husband, Nathan Holaday, during the first Synod session we participated in and we were honored Fr. Gillespie celebrated our wedding Mass on June 22, 2024 in the St. Ignatius Chapel, in the same location where YAC Mass and weekly faith sharing is held. Now as a married couple, our connection to Holy Trinity's call to be "men and women for others" is even stronger together.

Participating in a parish pledge and recurring giving has always been something my family instilled in me growing up, but I confidently choose to make a pledge to Holy Trinity now because I can see the direct impact my contributions have on the parish community and the greater Georgetown area. The parish pledge also helps support YACs by providing scholarship opportunities to go on retreats and the parish mission trips, financial support for social justice and volunteer events, and budget support for YAC fellowship and programming.

Whether it is through faith formation for parishioners of all ages, social justice advocacy and support for local and global communities, or the welcoming celebration of the liturgy and sacraments, I believe Holy Trinity is boldly living out its mission.

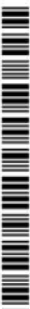

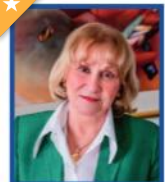
