Third Sunday of Advent

Remembering

The stories of David and Philis Thomas, Lucy and Liddy Butler, Anne Marie Becraft, and members of the Belt family, some of Holy Trinity's early African American parishioners, are now told on a handsome new memorial panel hanging in the hallway just outside the St. Ignatius Chapel.

From Holy Trinity's founding in the 1790s until the mid-19th century, the Chapel was our parish church. It was a segregated space. Approximately one-third of the congregation was made up of Black Catholics, some free and some enslaved, yet these parishioners had to enter the church from an outside staircase, sit in designated balconies, and take Communion after the White people.

Segregated seating continued in our current main church when it opened in 1851. Finally, in the 1920s, hundreds

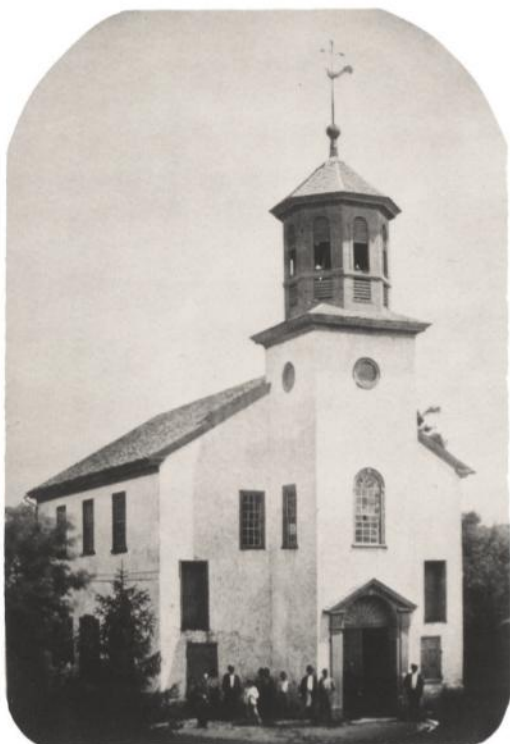

of Black parishioners left Holy Trinity to found Epiphany Catholic Church in Georgetown because of the disdainful treatment they experienced here.



The new memorial is one more step on our parish's collective journey to discover and remember the lessons of slavery, segregation, and race which are so deeply embedded in the story of Holy Trinity. As the new memorial panel describes this painful but very real history, let us reflect on our past and discern its implications for our present and our future.

The panel invites parishioners to remember all our African American brothers and sisters and the rich contributions they made to the parish and the wider Georgetown community.

We ask forgiveness for the sins of racism and the hurt they caused to parishioners like the Thomases, the Butlers, the Becrafts, and the Belts.

This new panel has been carefully and beautifully crafted with materials that correspond to the existing

Donor memorials in the Chapel hallway which date back many decades.

On **Monday, December 16**, following the 5:30 pm Mass in the Chapel, Father Kevin Gillespie will bless and dedicate the new memorial panel. The brief ceremony will be followed by a reception in the parish center rotunda. All are warmly invited and encouraged to attend.

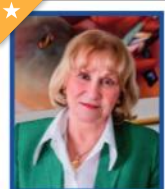

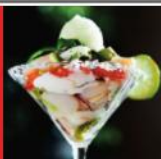
