### HEART AND HOPE

It is that time again, to review the past year and to imagine the new! As I look back on the year 2024, I am grateful and as I look forward to 2025, I am hopeful.

Personally, 2024 was the year of the heart. As many parishioners know, this past year I had four cardiac procedures, including open heart surgery. By the grace of God, the prayers of many of you, and the competent care of my physicians, nurses and caregivers I have pretty much recovered. Pope Francis's recent encyclical Dilexit Nos about the spirituality of the Sacred Heart certainly helped me to appreciate more deeply the graces of our heart becoming more like Christ's Heart.

Pastorally, as I look back upon the last 12 months, it was

in many ways an historic year. One important endeavor was made possible through the labors of our History Committee as we dedicated two plaques dealing with Holy Trinity's racial history.

This past Monday, a new plaque was blessed to the memory of the early African Americans, some of them enslaved people and some freed, who worshiped at Holy Trinity,

albeit in segregation. It is located in the hallway outside of the Chapel of St. Ignatius.

Earlier in the year, we dedicated a plaque located near the steps to the front entrance of the church. This sign recognizes that a century ago our black parishioners left Holy Trinity and formed Epiphany Catholic Church located on the other side of Georgetown.

These two plaques complement three other signs located outside the Neale Room. They, too, address aspects of the segregated history of the parish. One describes the legacy of racial contradictions of Father Francis Neale, the first pastor of Holy Trinity. A second describes the parish's segregated seating and a third describes the heroic work of Ann Marie Becraft as being one of "the four mothers of social activism in Black Washington."

This past year was also historic for the Catholic Church worldwide as there occurred the second session of the Synod in Rome. In response to the conclusion of the Synod and to the published Synodal Report, last month we held a panel discussion which some 80 parishioners attended. This was followed by a synodal discussion at the November meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council.

One practical parish follow up to the Synod is inviting parishioners to several sessions in which we will read and reflect on the Synod Report. The sessions will be led by Richard Coll, a parishioner who attended the Synod. The first meeting via Zoom will take place on Tuesday evening, January 22 from 6:30-7:30 – with more details to come.

Looking further ahead to 2025 we hope to have a variety of activities surrounding the Church's historic Jubilee Year of being "Pilgrims of Hope." A Jubilee Year banner will soon be hung outside the church. The first parish-sponsored pilgrimage will take place the weekend of January 10-12, when some 30 parishioners will visit the Legacy Museum in Montgomery as well as several other sites in Alabama focusing on our nation's civil rights history.

On behalf of our parish staff and my fellow Jesuits, Fathers Clifford, Dennis, Earl, and Kelley, I wish you and yours a joyful Christmas and a hope-filled New Year!

### 2024 HAITI SCHOLARSHIP AWARDEES

Meet our 8 new scholarship awardees for the Class of '24. (We're waiting to hear whether one other student is accepted into the nursing school in Jeremie.)



Unfortunately, the violence and challenges in Haiti have caused some students to discontinue or suspend their studies. This makes 39 (hopefully 40) students we're currently supporting with full tuition scholarships.

Since its inception in 2016, the St. Jean Baptiste Scholarship Program has graduated 11 students (one may still have some final graduation requirement to complete); received support from 88 donors; and assisted students attending 11 different post-secondary institutions in Haiti.

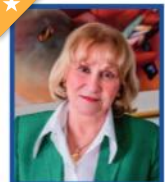

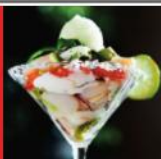
