- **Launched the 2025 Pledge Campaign:** This year's theme, Thanks for Giving, invites all of us to reflect on how our faith inspires our giving.
- **Laid the Groundwork for the Future:** Begun planning for the upcoming capital campaign, which will be crucial for addressing our parish's long-term needs.

I am deeply grateful for your support during these first months of my role. I have met many of you in

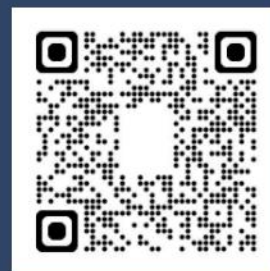
