Fighting Poverty in Haiti

From The Holy Trinity St. Jean Baptiste Committee

Holy Trinity began a sister parish relationship with St. Jean Baptiste in Haiti in 2010. Although we are not currently able to visit, we remain in constant contact with the pastor, Père Lesly. We also continue to work with Food for the Poor to address hunger and housing on site. In 2011, we launched a scholarship program for secondary school students to attend university. To date, Holy Trinity parishioners have supported 63 students, and we have 39 students currently enrolled. This weekend, one of our first scholarship students, Nathalie Jn-Baptiste, is visiting Holy Trinity. We invited her to share her story:

I grew up with my father and stepmother in Anse d’Hainault. I saw my natural mother twice a week. I attended kindergarten and primary school at Sainte Marguerite d’Youville, Jérémie. In 2009, my mother passed away and that same year I started my secondary studies at Saint Raymond College. In 2014, my father passed away. A cousin on my mother’s side took charge of me.

In 2016, when I was in my final year of high school, I had the chance to meet a team from Holy Trinity of which Kittie Fitzgerald was a part. I was the winner (first place) of my class during the final (government) baccalaureate exam. Père Medard and Director Markel Jean contacted me about a four-year scholarship. This was such good news, in fact the best news, I received during that year. I contacted Kittie, and Holy

Trinity paid for four years of study in Nursing. In conclusion, my life at Anse d’Hainault was good.

Since my childhood, I always dreamed of being a nurse. Growing up, my empathy and altruism allowed me to have more enthusiasm for nursing. When my parents fell ill, I did not have the ability to help them and take care of them. This state of helplessness multiplied my love for this profession, and it was at this moment that I said to myself that I want to become a nurse.

The members of Holy Trinity supported me financially and morally during my four years of study in Nursing at the Adventist University of Haiti. My bills were paid on time. Although these four years were not very easy, thanks to Holy Trinity, I have succeeded in my studies in Nursing.

Today, my life is full of good things and passions. The difficulties I encountered have encouraged me and helped me to move forward little by little towards my goals. Knowing that the members of Holy Trinity continue to help other young people in their studies makes me very happy because it is a very generous and saving gesture, knowing how difficult it is financially for a young person to enroll and complete studies at a university in Haiti

I now live in Brooklyn with my cousin as part of the humanitarian parole program. I work in healthcare, but my concern is about my status here in the USA going forward. I am currently in need of a lawyer to apply for asylum. My projects in the USA are to obtain my license in Nursing and to work as a nurse, to flourish in all aspects (professional, financial and others) and to continue with my studies.

Dear Benefactors of Holy Trinity,

At the beginning of this New Year, on behalf of the entire parish of St Jean Baptiste in Anse d'Hainault, I have the joy of greeting you and offering you my best wishes for the new year. In a special way, I would like to thank you for your great generosity towards so many young people of St Raymond who did not hope to attend University but who are studying today thanks to you. You are God's blessing for them, for their parents, for the community.

In fact, Haiti has become a living hell today. With the situation of continuous and increasing violence of armed gangs, the population that was already poor is plunged into misery. Parents are unemployed, the economy is devastated, and the state is doing nothing to relieve the people.

In this painful circumstance, the vast majority of parents in Anse d'Hainault cannot feed their children or even pay for their studies. The scholarship program therefore saves the future of many intelligent and dynamic young people who did not expect anything after graduating from St. Raymond. The program helps train professionals not only for Anse d'Hainault but also for the entire country. For example, beneficiaries have become teachers in St Raymond.

Also, through this program, you are energetically fighting against poverty and the gang phenomenon in Anse d'Hainault, you are preparing the basis for a more prosperous, safer and more progressive Anse d'Hainault.

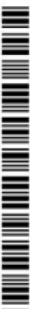

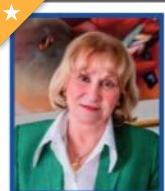
