For I Was Hungry...

“If the Church does not care for the poor, they will be neglected. That is the test of our faithfulness to Christ: how we relate to the poor.” —Fr. Horace McKenna, S.J. (inscribed in Holy Trinity’s McKenna Hall)

Preparing and serving a meal is an expression of love for family, for friends, and for others who enter our lives. Sharing a meal nourishes the body and builds relationships. At Holy Trinity, the offering of a meal for the homeless and others in need is a regular way that our community expresses our love for them—and is an expression of our faithfulness to Christ.

For ten nights over the Christmas and the New Year holidays, families prepared and served hot dinners for the guests of the Georgetown Ministry Center in our McKenna Hall. At Thanksgiving, parishioners and students cooked, served, or purchased and packed food for meals provided to hundreds of our friends at The Father McKenna Center, Woodley House, San Miguel School, Hope & a Home, So Others Might Eat (SOME), and our Migrant Familia. And many participated in America’s Trot for Hunger!

The Holy Trinity community comes together to share our blessings and build relationships with those in need throughout the year. Here are the ongoing programs:



- Every Sunday evening, parishioners prepare and serve a hot, sit-down dinner in Trinity Hall for as many as 80 women and men in need.
- In collaboration with other Georgetown churches, Holy Trinity parish volunteers prepare and serve dinner on Saturdays at Mt. Zion United Methodist Church to anyone from our neighborhood in need.
- Students at Holy Trinity School prepare about 500-800 sandwiches each Wednesday, donating them to those served by The Father McKenna Center or Martha’s Table. Students are actively engaged in other

parish food programs. The Eighth-Grade class begins each year with a “packathon” for Feed the Hunger, preparing about 10,000 meals for those in poverty overseas.

- Parishioners bring and share hot meals with guests at Holy Trinity partner organizations across the Washington, DC area. Meals are periodically shared with small groups of men and women who are migrants; citizens recently returned from incarceration; those with mental health disorders or intellectual disabilities, and others.
- Over the past 50+ years, generations of Religious Education students and parishioners have provided monthly lunch service to guests at SOME, preparing casseroles at home, and purchasing side dishes and drinks. This month, we return to in-person service for 100-200 individuals following a prolonged closure of the SOME dining room. While the dining room was closed, the parish created and donated more than 42,000 snack bags, used to create takeaway lunches. Parishioners also serve the annual Thanksgiving Day meal each year.
- As part of the monthly Community Food Collection (supporting the SOME meals), parishioners create breakfast casseroles at home for the men of The Father McKenna Center. Each casserole costs under \$20 to create and provides a hearty meal for 8-10.
- The Holy Trinity Tithe program (10% of parishioner pledges and regular collections) awarded more than \$500,000 to partner organizations in 2024, many of which have a primary role to address food insecurity and provide meals to those in need across our region.

Whether purchasing food, cooking it at home, collecting and delivering the donations, or serving a meal directly to those in need, these are all opportunities for parishioners to pray and reflect on the needs of the poor or marginalized, to give thanks for our blessings, and to express our faith in Christ.

All are welcome to participate in any of these parish programs during 2025 as you feel called. For more
