process easier. Expect to see ongoing enhancements. You can always check your giving history by logging into the User Center on the parish website.

The fiscal year at Holy Trinity runs from July to June. Our Pledge Campaign begins in the fall and runs until the following fall, which can cause confusion both internally and externally. There are no quick fixes to this process, but I would like to share our fundraising financials to show how we organize everything into buckets.

Offertory, Holiday Collections, and the Pledge Campaign are used as operating funds. Here is a quick breakdown of where we were at the end of December 2024:

Offertory	\$716,000	\$283,814	40%
Pledge	\$3,300,00	\$1,770,627	54%
Holiday	\$445,000	\$240,198	54%
Totals	\$4,461,000	\$2,294,639	51%

We are ahead of where we were at the end of 2023 by \$150,000.

Overall, for Fiscal Year 2025, we are at 50% of the budget. We are on track to end our fiscal year in June on a strong note! We are grateful for the commitment. But if you would like your gift to count before the fiscal year ends, please feel free to give when you can.

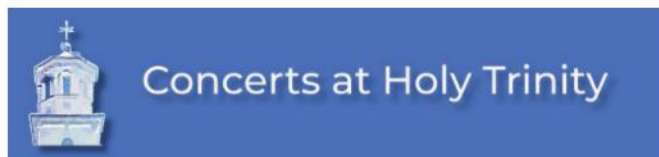
