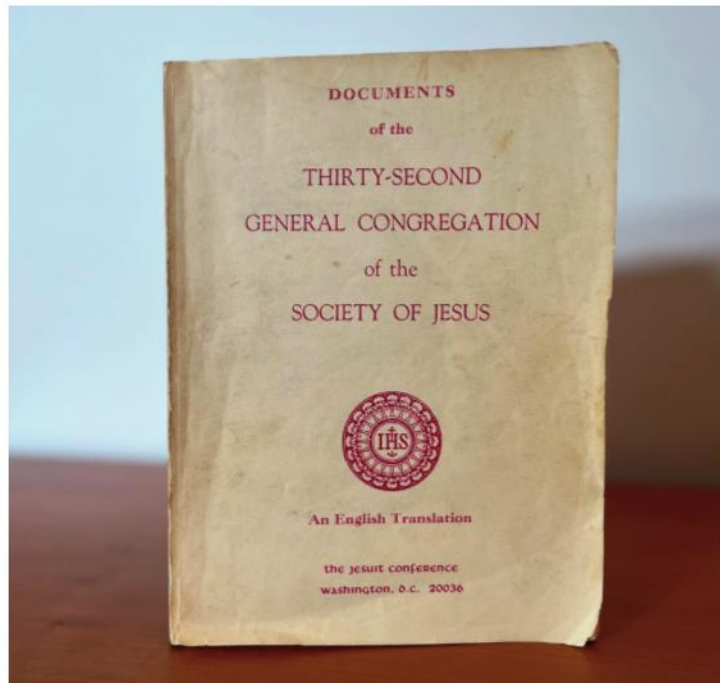
50 Years Of The Service Of Faith And The Promotion of Justice

Fifty years ago, on March 7, 1975, the Documents of the 32nd General Congregation of the Society of Jesus (CG 32) were issued. The General Congregation, an international body representing Jesuits from around the world, met between December 2, 1974, and March 7, 1975, and produced a 157-page document guiding how Jesuits, in the spirit of Vatican II, should respond to “the signs of the times.” The Superior General at the time, Father Pedro Arrupe, emphasized that faith had to be lived out in action.

Building upon the 1971 Synod of Bishops in which justice was declared to be a constitutive part of evangelization, the Society declared that all Jesuits and their institutions should define themselves in terms of carrying forth “The Service of Faith and the Promotion of Justice.”

In Decree 4 of the Documents, the Congregation articulated a fundamental link between faith and justice, reinforcing the Jesuits’ commitment to social transformation as an integral part of their religious mission. In so doing, the Congregation significantly changed the apostolic focus of its global educational and pastoral institutions.



At the time the CG 32 documents were published, I was serving as an assistant to Fr. Edward Brady, S.J. in the Peace Studies Program at the then-St. Joseph’s College (now Saint Joseph’s University). I should note that a group of us consisting of lay and religious men and women in the Philadelphia area were mentored by Fr. Brady’s charismatic wisdom, and were therefore known as “The Brady Bunch!” Informed by the spirit behind the CG 32 documents, the Peace Studies Program sponsored several conferences on

hunger, as well as programs dealing with “education for justice.”

Father Brady’s efforts around the “service of faith and the promotion of justice” later led in 1976 to the theme of The Eucharistic Congress, “The Hungers of the Human Family.” At that time Monica Hellwig, a theologian teaching at Georgetown and a Holy Trinity parishioner, wrote a book by that title.

Inspired by the documents of CG 32, I decided to enter the Society of Jesus in August of 1975, while Fr. Brady went on to found the Faith and Justice Institute at Saint Joseph’s University. (www.sju.edu/centers/faithjustice)

When I entered the Jesuits, my fellow novices and I were challenged to encounter a variety of apostolates dealing with situations of injustice. These included performing ministry at a county prison, working with migrant farm laborers in Delaware and Maryland, and serving the poor of inner-city Washington, DC under the guidance of Fr. Horace McKenna. In each ministry, we were challenged to ask questions pertaining to how our faith informed our promotion of justice and how justice helped to enhance our understanding of faith.

Moreover, throughout my studies as a young novice, my peers--who included Bill Kelley and Jack Dennis--and I were further formed around the faith-justice themes. Subsequent Jesuit General Congregations, GC 33 (1983), 34 (1995), 35 (2006) and 36 (2016) continued to formulate the themes surrounding the service of faith and the promotion of justice.

Certainly since 1975, the documents of CG 32 continue to challenge and inspire Jesuits and our colleagues. Here at Holy Trinity, the growth of our Ignatian Spirituality and Social Justice programs demonstrate our parishioners’ longstanding commitment to various programs serving our faith through the promotion of justice.

Of course, the social justice values promulgated fifty

years ago have had dangerous consequences. When they were approved, Father Arrupe stated aloud that Decree 4 of CG 32 could result in the deaths of many Jesuits and their colleagues. The 1989 killing of six Jesuits and their two female colleagues in El Salvador is the most significant instance, but there have been others.

One final note: One of the Jesuits who attended GC 32 was a young Jesuit provincial from Argentina named Jorge Bergoglio – the future Pope Francis.

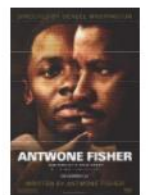

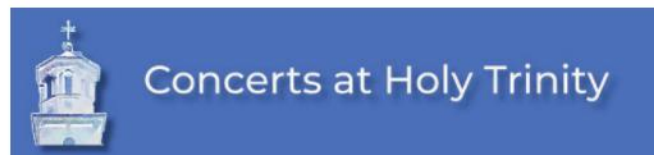


FAMILY STATIONS OF THE CROSS FOLLOWED BY A SIMPLE SUPPER
