Women in Ministry at Holy Trinity

Reflections from Four Holy Trinity Parishioners

Ignatian Spirituality by Barbara Bordelon. Several years ago while making the Spiritual Exercises, I was drawn to the ministry of spiritual direction. At the time I was a caregiver for my husband who had Parkinson's, and the meaning of the Cross was a struggle for me. Walking with Jesus through the Exercises, I experienced such transforming grace that I felt called to give the Exercises to others.

Ever since, my ministry has been to serve Holy Trinity as a spiritual director with the Ignatian Retreat Team – giving ongoing spiritual direction, the Spiritual Exercises, and retreats in daily life. I experience God's presence and the grace of the Spirit with each person I am privileged to accompany. It is deeply consoling to witness God working through a person's life and hear the insights with which God blesses them.

Ignatius of Loyola was a mystical and practical genius who understood the human condition and our struggles, and how to lead us in prayer to a salvific encounter with Jesus. It is experiencing others being led to that encounter by the Spirit that encourages me to continue this holy ministry.

Liturgy and Music by Barb Zientek Perez. Like any ministry, I was drawn to liturgy and music through others. My parents and extended family were members of the church choir, and it was foundational to our family life. I was a parish cantor by 7th grade! At Georgetown, wonderful Jesuit mentors like Father Larry Madden and Father Paul Cioffi fostered my passion and love of liturgy.

Father Jim English and I were classmates in Father Cioffi's class when Father English was exploring how to transform our church into a worship space that embodied Vatican II principles. I guess you would say I was completely taken by the Jesuits and never looked back!

Ministry is the defining word for me. We are all called to identify gifts God gives us and, in turn, share them with God's people. Music has been my pathway. I have been deeply privileged to accompany parishioners through good times and bad, through countless Sunday liturgies, baptisms and funerals, and everything in between. In each of these circumstances, we share our love of God, the reality of our lives, and continue our journey to serve God and one another more deeply and fully. At the cantor stand, I am continually struck by the wall of sound that

I am privileged to hear when the assembly sings – a sound of one people, united in belief and faith in a God who loves us. I get to witness that belief in your faces when you sing: the tears, the joy, the grief, the hope, the love, and the outpouring of your faith as expressed through our one shared voice. Keep singing! Your voice matters!

Faith Formation by Maureen Szemborski. “Have you two ever considered helping with RCIA?” The question came during our 2018 marriage preparation session with Fr. Paul Campbell. My now-husband Matthew and I recognized that we had received a divine invitation, and we were ready to say “Yes.”

Responding to God’s gentle, persistent invitations is at the heart of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA - in case you missed it, we have a new name!). The reasons that compel catechumens (those seeking baptism) and candidates (those baptized in another faith tradition) to seek the sacraments are as unique as the individuals themselves. As a cradle Catholic, I associated OCIA with fiancés, and at Holy Trinity, we do encounter our fair share of the recently engaged. But we also welcome young adults drawn to the rich traditions of the Catholic Church, parents inspired by their children’s experience with Catholic schools, and adults in their sixties (and later) who have sought God throughout their lives.

On paper, I may have the role of catechist (along with Gene Morris, Walt Grazer, and our fearless leader, Anne Koester), but the joy of this ministry comes from walking with people on their journeys with Christ. The privilege of hearing and holding our catechumens’ and candidates’ stories is one I do not take lightly. As Pope Francis so often reminds us, accompanying others helps me to recognize the places in my own heart in need of growth and healing. I will forever be grateful for the opportunity to participate in this grace-filled ministry.

Social Justice Ministry by Cristina Torres. “Thank you for trusting us with your children” was a phrase my husband and I often heard when our oldest daughter was welcomed to Holy Trinity School (HTS) many years ago. As a young mother at the time, I remember thinking our family was blessed to have found a place where teachings of faith, service, and justice would play an important role in the education of our children. I trusted HTS would be exactly that place. A few years later, when it was our youngest son’s time to enroll, such trust had evolved into certainty and a

desire to be part of a vibrant community to which our family could give back.

At Holy Trinity, our family has witnessed innumerable signs of God’s love and a genuine commitment to be “people for others.” At HTS, my children learned to bring sandwiches to be donated to our homeless neighbors. They have packed meals and volunteered to serve dinner to others in need, picked crops to be donated to food banks in our area, donated diapers for young mothers in need, and wrapped Christmas gifts for less fortunate children.

I found it impossible to remain indifferent to HTS’ efforts to instill in my children the importance of serving those in need. Thus, I joined the school’s Social Justice Committee to help keep some of these projects alive. I have met an incredible group of parents deeply committed to raising sensitive, kind individuals. I have seen an unparalleled generosity that surpasses the goals of the small projects at hand. I have learned that better outcomes are achieved when people work together without seeking individual recognition. And most of the time, it’s not necessary to do big fundraisers to transform lives. Small acts of kindness and little donations touch our neighbors’ lives equally and help us deepen our relationship with God.

In recent years, I’ve been honored to be the school liaison to the parish’s Social Justice Committee. Men and women in this ministry are truly catalysts for social justice and community building. I am thankful for the chance to learn from the impressive work they conduct on many different fronts. I feel blessed and proud to be a parishioner at a place where faith and action come together in the pursuit of justice and equity. Today, I am thankful to Holy Trinity for trusting me to be a part of this ministry.

Thank you to the parish volunteers who met with members of the HT Migrant Familia and Restoration Immigration Legal Aid last Sunday to complete taxes! We are fortunate to have accomplished lawyers and accountants who love this time of year and are willing to share their expertise with our community.

Our families are pursuing legal pathways to life in the U.S., which are now in jeopardy. We ask that you continue to pray for our families, especially: the Azizi family from Afghanistan whose four-year-old with chronic cerebral palsy relies on Medicaid to receive life-saving therapy; the Bautistas from Colombia; Michel Ange and the Bernards from Haiti; the Venezuelan family still waiting for work permits and whose four year old son is thriving at school; Katya and her two sons from Ukraine; and the rest of families fleeing Afghanistan, Burma, Cameroon, Colombia, Congo, Gabon, Haiti, Honduras, Nicaragua, Sudan, Syria, Ukraine, and Venezuela.
