Pray - Fast - Give

The commands to pray, fast, and give are so familiar to me at the start of Lent that I sometimes fail to examine them. This year, as a part of my own Lenten practice in preparation for the joy of Easter Sunday, I have tried to take a step back to see how I can live these practices in a fresh way that calls my heart to expand as I prepare to receive the great gift of the Resurrection.

So, as I often do when I am seeking inspiration, I asked students to share with me how they see praying, fasting and giving from their perspective. Here are some highlights from recent conversations with students about these pillars of Lent:

- "Prayer is more than something we do, it is something we feel. We can pray for peace, love, and kindness. I pray when I am happy, sad, angry, or glad. I feel like I am next to God, talking and praying with God, because he is with me." - *Genie D., 6th grade*
- "What prayer means to me is talking to God peacefully, lovingly, and kindly. I talk to God about what problems I have, to get solutions, and to share what I am thankful for." - *Rosemary K., 3rd grade*

- "Fasting means to stop things that distract you from doing things that help you grow closer to God and grow in your faith." - *Josephine P., 4th grade*
- "The meaning of give to me means more than just paying money to charity. Even while giving money you could be using is great, that is not the only way you can help out. Give means to give back to the

NEW SISTER PARISH - ST. CATHERINE'S AT THE SHRINE OF THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD IN BETHLEHEM

Earlier this year, Fr. Kevin and the Social Justice Committee received an invitation from Fr. Rami Asakrieh, OFM to enter into a sister parish relationship with the Church of St. Catherine's at the Shrine of the Nativity of our Lord in Bethlehem. St. Catherine's Parish serves 1,516 Catholic Palestinian families.

In his initial correspondence, Fr. Rami shared that the "economic life of Bethlehem has hit rock bottom and the weakest members of society are suffering the most." We began a WhatsApp correspondence with Fr. Rami and members of his community. The Social Justice ministry invited interested parishioners to pray and to discuss this opportunity. There was a desire to be in community with and to foster discussion and engagement, and parishioners Alex Tarzikhan and Kholoud Hilaneh agreed to lead the committee.

We are fortunate to have wonderful relationship models from our current relationships with St. Jean Baptiste in Haiti and Maria Madre de los Pobres in El Salvador. A financial contribution will be part of our tithe discussions this spring. In the meantime, Alex and Kholoud will be meeting with St. Catherine's parish leaders to understand their priorities and to identify opportunities for virtual gatherings.
