

# Ephphetha: That Is, Be Opened

On Holy Saturday morning, we will celebrate the "preparation rites" with our Elect, who will be baptized that night at the Easter Vigil. There are two such preparation rites pulled forward from earlier centuries.

First, in the ancient Church, Christians shared the Creed with those seeking baptism shortly before their initiation into the Church. On Holy Saturday morning, those to be baptized recited the Creed, symbolically making it their own as they prepared to become members of the Body of Christ.

Second, by the 7th century, there is also evidence of a ritual called the *ephphetha*, an Aramaic word that means "be opened." (Aramaic was one of the Semitic languages at the time of Jesus; it was closely related to Hebrew.)

Mark 7:31-37 provides the scriptural foundation for this rite. In this passage, people bring a deaf man with a speech impediment to Jesus. Jesus puts his fingers in the man's ears and touches his tongue, and says, "ephphetha." The man is able to hear and speak plainly. Christians found this account compelling and incorporated it into pre-baptismal rituals (which also included an anointing with the oil of

exorcism -- today called the oil of catechumens).

The contemporary Church has preserved this ephphetha ritual. For the Elect, it is celebrated prior to baptism on Holy Saturday morning. The ears and lips of the Elect will be touched, as these words are prayed: "Ephphetha: that is, be opened, that you may profess the faith you hear, to the praise and glory of God."

All are welcome to join us in the Church on Holy Saturday at 9:00 a.m. for Morning Prayer and the Preparation Rites with the Elect (those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil)
